

NHS ART CLASS SEEKING FISH DONATIONS!

Hello Nestucca Community!

My name is Sydney Leja, and I am the current art teacher at Nestucca High. This year, I was hoping to teach Gyotaku fish printing,

which, simply put, is covering a dead fish with paint and using it as a stamp.



I was hoping that anyone who may fish, go clamming or crabbing, or regularly purchases seafood, or owns a fishing/Dory charter might be willing to donate a fish to our art class.

Fish/animals we are looking for are any and all:

- fish with unique shapes (rockfish? Cod? Halibut?)
- -fish of any size, small, medium, large, xl,- anything from minnows/anchovies to large salmon or cod, etc

-Fish/shellfish/mollusks from

- -the ocean
- -rivers/streams (salmon?)
- -lake/pond (bluegill, bass?)
- mollusks of any size/shape (oysters, mussels, gooseneck barnacles, etc)
- shellfish (dungeness crab, shrimp, crayfish, etc)
- -fish you may have forgotten was in the freezer for a few years and probably has freezerburn
- -fish can be ones you may not consider food grade, like one with a weird growth or missing an eye or something. Honestly I'm not sure how you would judge a fish to throw back or keep, but I thought it was worth mentioning.

I understand that many people value these animals as food and may find this wasteful, but I was hoping to use it as a tool to teach students about ocean biology, animal anatomy, and art history as well as teaching them the art process, as to value the life of these animals as much as we can. We need *full body* fish- they can be gutted but we can't use fish *meat* specifically.

Once the fish are used for this project, they would no longer be food safe; *however*, I do think we could potentially preserve them for future use.
