SCHOOL SAFETY

The continued tragic and violent events which occur at schools around our nation shock and sadden all of us. We grieve with the families and hold our own families closer as a result. It is a challenge for us all to find the words and actions that will comfort and reassure our children in the midst of such tragic violence. I have attached an article, Helping Children Cope with Tragedy (Cómo Ayudar a los Niños a Enfrentar una Tragedia) I hope that all of you also received the district communication from Superintendent, Dr. Provost.

Here at R.K. Finn Ryan Road School, staff members have heard very little conversation or questions from students, and we have not brought the recent Florida event into classroom discussion, as we try and be sensitive to the desire of many parents to shield their children from these horrors. However, questions sometimes come up in classrooms as these types of events occurring in schools often create fear and anxiety in children. If that happens, teachers will have developmentally appropriate discussions that address feelings of fear and confusion for children. We will let them know that keeping our school a safe place is our number one priority, and review our safety procedures with them. Our Ryan Road staff works hard to create a safe and caring community. Procedures we have in place include single entry access and sign-in for visitors, exterior cameras, evacuation and lock down procedures, and a vigilant and well-trained staff. We take the responsibility of keeping our children safe very seriously.

On March 14, many students in the United States are planning a National School Walkout at 10:00, which will last for 17 minutes to honor the 17 people killed in the Florida shooting. According to Women's March Youth EMPOWER organizers, the walkout is a call to Congress to "pass legislation to keep us safe from gun violence at our schools, on our streets and in our homes and places of worship." We will not be participating as a school and will not discuss the event unless students bring it up with questions. However, if any students speak to their teachers or to me about wanting to participate, I will make sure to honor their feelings.

MCAS TESTING THIS SPRING

Our students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will be taking MCAS tests this spring. The English Language Arts MCAS will take place in April, and the Math MCAS will take place in May. Our 4thand 5thgraders will be taking the tests online this year. It is very important that students be present for testing and arrive to school on time. We encourage families to avoid making appointments for students on testing days.

It is important to remember that any test is only one measure of a child's performance at school. Teacher evaluations through the years, day-to-day work, and other types of performance assessments and projects are additional ways to evaluate learning. However, these tests are important, and we are doing all we can to prepare our students to take these tests with calm confidence.


