#### **CLASSROOM USE OF VIDEOS**

The JSS Council was asked to look at the issue of video use in classrooms at our school. We decided the best way to do that would be to survey all the teachers. Here is the survey we used:

USE OF VIDEO SURVEY

A question came to the JSS Council about using videos in classrooms and if there are guidelines/policies in the school. The Council members know that teachers are the first to ask about this – and before we can answer, we need to know the following info:

•	1. Total grade Level/Dept
•	2. Do you show videos in your classroom?
	If so, are the videos part of the curriculum?
•	3. Are there times that you show videos that are not (necessarily) part of the curriculum?
	If so, what types of videos?
•	4. How often?
	1x per week 1x per month Less frequent?

#### RESULTS OF THE USE OF VIDEO SURVEY BY GRADE/DEPT.

- 1. 1st grade 2. Sometimes. Only as part of the curriculum. 3. No/maybe once a year as a special day. COMMENTS: We watch the YouTube "Power of Yet", the bald eagle cam, to hear songs/tunes we are learning, science curriculum
- 1. 2nd grade 2. Yes/sometimes. 3. Only part of the curriculum/educational, last day of school, "crazy day". 4. 1-2 times per year, examples: Paddington, Inside Out.
- 1. 3rd grade 2. Yes. 3. Mostly part of the curriculum raptor cams, Mystery Science. 4. Frequency: 1 x/week COMMENTS: For students who have had less experiences outside of school, visual examples linked to the curriculum, only use high quality curriculumrelated materials, infrequently.
- 1. 4th grade 2. Yes. 3. Clips/Mystery Science, National Geo. Teachers College Readers/Writers Workshop. 4. 1x/week. COMMENTS: Clips vary from 1 min-10min. Sometimes literacy related, science/social studies/math. Example: For non-fiction reading unit, we watched brief video on Celebrating International Women's Day to examine 4 common non-fiction text structures to show that they are common in all types of non-fiction (not just books).
- 1. 5th grade 2. Yes 3. Part of curriculum Go Noodle, sample debates, science/social studies, Upworthy, NY Times/The Atlantic news videos, crash course kids 4. Frequency: 1-2x/week. COMMENTS: This needs to be part of a larger conversation, I'm happy to be transparent about my use of videos to supplement my teaching, but let's make it a grade-wide/school-wide conversation. It would be helpful if there were guidelines around this. I think we need to have some thoughtful discussion about both screen time and content.
- 1. Specialists 2. Almost never, yes, short clips always part of the curriculum 3. Examples: Power of Yet, health and fitness, artist interview.

In this day of media saturation, I was very pleased to hear from our teachers about their careful, professional practices as well as their desire to have more conversations. I will check with my principal/administrative colleagues about practices in other schools and leave time/space for further discussion in future faculty meetings.
