### **IMPORTANT REMINDERS**



Our district elementary schools provide adult supervision for students beginning at 8:30am. Please do not drop off students to Ryan Road School before this time. If you need before school child care, call the YMCA, which manages before and after school care right at our school beginning at 7:00 AM and ending in the afternoon at 6:00 PM. We all begin our day outdoors unless it is raining or colder than 15 degrees. Breakfast is available in the cafeteria beginning at 8:30. The bell rings to start our day at 8:50. Good attendance and arriving to school on time help children feel relaxed and be more successful at school. Some parents stay for our morning recess, which is fine (it often feels like a daily family party), but parent supervision is not required during this time. School is dismissed at 3:00.

**At dismissal**, Kindergarten students are dismissed from the main front entryway by teachers, first and second grade students will be dismissed by teachers from the doorway on the left, and 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will be dismissed from the doorway on the right.

### **SCHOOL HANDBOOK**

#### **PARKING**

Please park and meet students at the end of the day. We have additional parking spaces by the basketball hoops so that there are enough parking spaces. Please use the designated spots in our parking lot. The drop-off spots are not for parking. Please be cautious when pulling out of parking spaces, as we have many parents who transport children, and the lot is bustling with people walking to and from the school building. Also, remember that there is NO SMOKING on school property. Please look at the attached "Parking/Traffic Map" and let me know if you have any questions. Thanks!

### **SCENT-FREE SCHOOL**

Please remember that we are a scent-aware learning community. We have people here who have allergies to scented products, and we ask that you and your children refrain from wearing these products at school. Thanks for your cooperation.



#### **CLASSROOM SNACKS**

This is a reminder that there is a time every day in classrooms when the students have snack. We hope that families will send a healthy snack if they are able. We realize, however, that sometimes families have a hard time providing snack for their children. I buy snacks that we have in the office, and some teachers and staff help with purchasing snacks when they are able, but these donations from our staff and me are meant to support families who really need the extra support or if students occasionally forget a snack. Please send a snack to school with your child(ren) if you are able. Thanks!





### DOGS/PETS

All four of the Northampton Elementary Schools have established a district-wide rule about dogs (or other pets) on the playground and in the school. In the first case, even if dogs are on a leash, they cannot be brought onto the playground/school grounds during school hours. Many children are afraid of dogs, even if they are friendly, and we also cannot risk any of our students getting hurt by dogs. If you like to walk your dog to pick up your child(ren), please meet on the far side of the playground area.

There is also a district "Pets in School" policy – developed by the Health Services Department that states that we do not have pets visit schools. Again the reason for this is safety and respect for all, as well as allergies. There are special occasions when an animal can visit outside of the school and students can come out to see it. This always has to be arranged in advance with permission from the school nurse and the principal.

New ESP in the Library: <u>Jennifer Clarson</u>. Jennifer is the mom of Maddie and Avery, who were in our 5<sup>th</sup> grade last year. Jennifer was a school librarian in NYC before the girls were born, and she has a Masters degree in Elementary Education.

Other New ESPs: <u>Brian Peltier</u> (with 5<sup>th</sup> grade), <u>Jennifer Costa</u> (with 1<sup>st</sup> grade), and <u>Susan Lucas</u> (with 2<sup>nd</sup> grade) are all excellent additions to our staff. In addition to their time with grade levels, they also assist with recess and lunch duties for various grades.

**YEP**: Ms. Liu and Ms. Keillor will be teaming up to lead YEP (Youth Enrichment Program) this year. YEP is our after school enrichment program, and you will receive information about our fall session soon.

Also, if you have heard that Mr. Kerstetter is back, he is filling in for  $5^{th}$  grade teacher Ms. Andrews until she recovers from surgery (soon).





### **OUR SCHOOL GARDEN!**

We will be continuing our partnership with School Sprouts this fall, which is made possible through NEF (Northampton Education Foundation) funding. All of our students will spend three classes in the garden in the fall and four in the spring. Gardening days will be on Fridays this year.

#### SCHOOL COUNCIL
