MCAS

MCAS stands for Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment Systems. When the concept was first introduced, as part of the Education Reform Act, in 1993, it was intended to be systemS, plural. It was envisioned to include a test but also portfolios, exhibits, teacher assessment and more – recognizing that one test does NOT give a full picture of students' performances as well as what they know. Somehow all but the test was lost or put aside.

So we have been giving the tests since then. It is based on the MA State Standards of Education and has changed over time, based on student performance and test experts' analysis. In my opinion the idea of "accountability" and assessing what students know and do is a great idea. Expecting that we can capture that in one test is the problem. Also, a test does not/cannot take into account those students who learning disabilities, native language other than English and the general challenges for test taking. We are allowed to and do have accommodations for students, through the special education process AND now, through what are called UNIVERSAL ACCOMMODATIONS (you can look these up on the MA Dept. of Secondary and Elementary Education (DESE). Having those accommodations are critical and do allow for greater success for the students taking them.

We do not "teach to the test" per se, but we do teach the curriculum which is based on the MA Standards. Our district and state curriculum and materials are good ones and are viewed as best practice nationwide. We are happy to be teaching these. We also help student learn how to take tests – practice, practice, and practice. And reassure, reassure – our mantra is "Just do your best and it will be fine". We tell our students that the test is just one way that we measure their growth and are also important for us, as their teachers, to figure out better ways to teach them.

This year ALL students will take the MCAS online, unless they have an accommodation for paper-based tests. Teachers have been practicing with the chrome books (little laptops) so students feel comfortable when it comes time to take the test. In my many years here at JSS, I have observed how wonderfully the teachers set the stage for taking the MCAS and help students really do try their best. Again, it is just one measure and we know that your children have much more that they can do, show and be proud of. If you have questions/concerns, please let your child's teacher or me know.
