Dear Parents:

For the 21st year in a row, the Northampton Survival Center is pleased to offer our Kids' Summer Food Program to eligible children through our food pantries in Northampton and Goshen. This program provides free groceries throughout summer vacation. To be eligible for this program, children must live in one of the towns in our service area (listed on the left) and receive free or subsidized meals through their school. Eligible children range in age from those who have just completed kindergarten to those starting 12th grade in the fall of 2019.

Beginning on June 3rd, eligible families may pick up food from this program in addition to the food they may already be collecting for the family. Once each month of the summer, as they select an assortment of groceries for the household, families of school-age children will select additional grocery items for their kids, including grains, protein, dairy items, fresh produce, and canned fruits and vegetables.

Every time you come to pick up food, you must bring **current proof of each child** participating in the program (for example: new MassHealth card, recent letter from the school indicating child's name and address, or doctor's bill).

Please also bring a **proof of your address** (recent piece of mail or current bill).
