#### TCB - Taking Care of Business

- Please be aware that the entrance to the 2nd parking lot/basketball court needs to be open and not blocked by parked cars. We need this as a parking lot during the school day (it turns back into a basketball court after school) so please either continue on into this lot or park elsewhere in the main lot.
- GATES! The school dept. installed gates at our bus loop entry to the back as well as on the driveway where the early childhood playground is for safety. We have tried "policing" the back blacktop area to prevent students from getting hurt but it hasn't worked. Thank you for parking in our parking lot and walking to the playground/back doors.
- COLD WEATHER GEAR & SHOES It appears that winter weather is upon us at least for the next few days. We go outside for recess and breaks every day UNLESS it is raining or the temperature/windchill is below 15 degrees Fahrenheit. That means that student must come dressed for outdoor play in the cold winter jackets, mittens, hat, scarves, boots and snow pants (if there's snow!). We have coats to lend/giveaway. If it is below freezing/32 degrees, students must wear jackets/coats if they haven't brought one to school, they can borrow. It is a school rule for safety. In the summer, we ask that students not wear flip flops for safety. In the cold weather, we ask that they not wear crocs/slides when playing sports again this is for safety.

#### **JSS Art Corner**

### For this month I want to highlight the Third Graders.

Over the past couple of months they have been working hard on their drawing skills. The first lesson focused on art history, and introducing them to Vincent van Gogh. Over the summer I went to the Springfield Art Museum and saw an amazing hands on exhibit featuring van Gogh. His Room in Arles was an actual room you could walk in and sit on his bed. This was my inspiration for the third graders to create their own room on paper. They created their furniture first, then drew the room lines to look 3-D. Their next project was choosing a photograph of an animal, drawing it larger onto their paper and coloring them using texture with colored pencils. The fun part was painting their frames for their portraits using Liquid Metal. This metallic paint made their frames look golden and beautiful! When they cut out the center of the frames the leftover paper was made into their own Art Journals. You may have seen your child drawing in their journals. The framed animals will be hanging in the hallways soon.


