Weekly pooled testing, reflex testing for positive pools, symptomatic testing, and home testing will continue. We have had over 1600 staff absences and 4,400 student absences over the past 4 weeks. A large portion of these are related to COVID, and these numbers are much higher than normal. At times, it has been difficult to keep schools open. During the first two weeks of May we had 8 disease clusters in the schools. Since masking was reinstated, there have been three additional clusters.

A city-wide mask advisory will be considered at the Board of Health meeting scheduled for May 25th. In consideration of the continued disease spread within our schools and the potential for new city-wide guidance from the Board of Health, the District will maintain the current mask requirement until the Board is able to meet to provide further guidance.
