Transitioning Back to Full-Pay School Meals for the 2022-2023 School Year

During the last school year, children and families benefitted from no-cost school meals for all students, made possible by special meal waivers during the pandemic from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). Unfortunately, these free school meals have expired. We are no longer able to provide delicious, nutritious meals for our students at no charge to families. As we transition back to full-pay school meals for the 2022-2023 school year, it is vitally important to us that all eligible students receive the help they need to continue to be well nourished and ready for learning every day. However, some households may qualify for free or reduced-price meal benefits. Eligibility is based on (1.) federal income guidelines or (2.) participation in other programs such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Ohio Works First. For example, a child in a family of four with a yearly income of \$51,338 or less would qualify for reduced-price meals. Families that believe their income is under the limit should fill

out an application for free or reduced-price meals through their school. To determine if your students are eligible for free or reduced-price meals, you are required to fill out the application. We encourage you to fill out the online Free and Reduced Priced Meal Application at PaySchools Central, which is available at <https://payschoolscentral.com> or visit the district website to access the online application and more information. By filling out the form online, you will know immediately if your family qualifies for free or reduced meals.

Don't have online access? Paper applications can be picked up at the district office entrance hall or you can email Jill Lauter at jill.lauter@northcantonschools.org to request a paper or e-file application.

Unsure if you meet the income requirements? Filling out an application is free, and we encourage you to go ahead and submit your information. You may qualify!

*Please note that the Free and Reduced-Price Meal application must be completed every school year and you can reapply as often as needed throughout the year if your household income amounts change.

The Purpose of State Tests and North Canton's Spring 2022 State Test Results

Although the grade levels and subjects tested have changed over the years, state tests have existed in Ohio in some format since the early 1990s. Ohio's State Tests are summative tests taken by all students near the end of each school year which attempt to measure how much learning has occurred. The content on these tests is based on Ohio's Learning Standards, which prescribes what information and skills students are supposed to learn in each grade level in each content area as well as in each high school course. The test results also help measure each public school and district's performance, which is reflected on its annual Ohio School Report Card that is released to the public by the Ohio Department of Education each fall. Lastly, the test results provide valuable information to teachers within school buildings and districts to help them adjust instruction accordingly for the following school year if they see patterns in student achievement, or lack thereof, based on overall student scores.

Students in grades three through eight take tests in English Language Arts and math. Additionally, there are science tests in grades five and eight. In high school, students take tests in English II, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, American History, and American Government. If a student takes any of the high school courses while in middle school, then they take the high school state test that year as well.

I am happy to report that after state tests scores decreased statewide, county-wide, and in North Canton in 2021 compared to 2019 (there were no state tests in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic), preliminary data released by the state show that scores in North Canton increased significantly in Spring 2022 compared to Spring 2021. Out of the 20 different tests from grade three through high school, the district's passing percentage increased on 13 of those tests with the average increase in the percentage of students passing being 4.73%. The biggest increases in passing percent occurred in third-grade English Language Arts (increase of 11%), sixth-grade math (increase of 9%), fifth-grade math (increase of 8%), and seventh-grade math (increase of 6%). On the seven tests where the passing percentage decreased, the average decrease was only 2.3% with three of those decreases being 1.2% or less. Overall, out of the approximately 6,000 tests taken in the North Canton City School District, a passing score was achieved on more than 81% of all those state tests in 2022 compared to 79% in 2021, which marked the biggest overall increase district-wide since 2017.

We want to recognize that all of the learning that is reflected in these test results is the culmination of a lot of hard work by our students as well as a lot of hard work and support on the part of our staff and parents. Thank you to the students, staff, and parents for helping North Canton students achieve some of the top results in Stark County.

Do you get summer break off too?

I get this question a lot when people hear I work for a school district. I usually chuckle a bit, and then start the explanation of what goes on in a treasurer's office in the summer. Here is a list of some of the things that go on in our office over the summer months.

Fiscal Year - The finances of a school district run from July 1st through June 30th.

Year-end closing - In addition to our typical month-end balancing and reconciling, we need to also ensure that everything is balanced for the fiscal year. Once this is completed, we work with our data center, SPARCC, to properly backup and archive our data for the year. We then need to open the new year by creating any new accounts we may need and loading our new budgets for the next year.

Budgets - As we come to the end of the year, and start of another, we have a lot of budget work to do. We need to make sure all of our Stark

County, and State, Auditor compliance requirements are met. If we need to make any final adjustments that require board of education approval, these need to be completed before June 30th. In regard to the next year, we are required to have temporary budgets approved by the board prior to July 1st. Once we roll into the new year, and our temporary budgets have been loaded into our system, we begin refining our permanent budgets that also require board approval.

Grants - We typically receive 8-10 state and federal grants every year, totaling approximately \$4 million. There is extensive testing done by our auditors on these grants, and we need to ensure that everything is properly documented and posted in our accounting system. We do not receive total grant amounts at the beginning of each year, but need to make monthly cash requests based on our actual spending. The State of Ohio shuts down their payment center from roughly June 15 to July 15, so we need to calculate and request enough money to cover the expenses during that time. In July and August, we are making all final payments and processing our final expenditure reports.

Staffing - Summer is a busy time for staffing. We are working with individuals who are leaving the district, either retiring or who may have resigned. As other administrators in the district are interviewing to fill openings, we are verifying employment offers, creating contracts, and entering new staff into our payroll system.

Audit - Once we cross into the new fiscal year, we will begin working with our auditors. The first set of auditors are for our conversion from "cash basis" to a "modified accrual GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles) basis." This phase develops all of our financial statements for our financial audit performed by the Ohio State Auditor's Office. Once all of our financial reports are completed the State Auditor's will begin their field work to audit our cash transactions, financial reports, internal controls and grants.

This is not an exhaustive list of what goes on during the summer, but gives you a good idea that our office is a very busy place during the summer. I am extremely thankful for my staff, Michele Bender, Margy Currier, Barb Bissler and Debbie Crowl, and all the hard work they put in every day.

 ** We cannot approve an application that is not complete **

- **Use Black or Blue ink.**
- **Print Clearly.**
- **Use your student's name as it appears on the birth certificate.**
- **List ALL Other Household Members.**
- **Fill in the last 4 digits of the Social Security Number for the signer or write "NONE."**
- **Foster child may be completed on a separate form; however, regulations now state that foster children may be included in the household application as part of the household size.**

Ryan Pedrone earns Believe in Ohio Scholarship



Funded by the State of Ohio through the Department of Higher Education and operated as a program of The Ohio Academy of Science, Believe in Ohio is a STEM and entrepreneurship program that teaches students how to commercialize products and services and create business plans that are driven by innovation. Hoover High School rising sophomore **Ryan Pedrone** is the recipient of a \$5,000 scholarship for his project, Cell Phob, an app that prevents people from losing their keys or getting their car keys stolen.

A total of 37 STEM Commercialization and STEM Business Plans were awarded with \$277,500 in scholarships at the Believe in Ohio State Competition. These scholarships can only be used to attend an Ohio college, university, or technical college. In 2022, the Believe in Ohio program awarded \$468,500 scholarships in total.

"This year's projects were not only amazing, but also very inspiring", said Michael E. Woytek, Executive Director for The Ohio Academy of Science. Woytek went on to add, "the Believe in Ohio program provides students with a vision of what's possible as it broadens and builds critical skills needed to compete in today's economy. It also provides them with a sense of purpose for pursuing post-secondary opportunities, here in Ohio."

Believe in Ohio is a free, comprehensive, curriculum-based, STEM and entrepreneurship program for Ohio high school students. The program is designed to create a "Culture of Innovation" and to prepare students to meet the demands of a rapidly changing labor market and become contributors to Ohio's innovation economy. Believe in Ohio is a program of **The Ohio Academy of Science** and was collaboratively developed with **Entrepreneurial Engagement Ohio**. Five New Buses

This fall the district will add five new school buses - all of which will be powered by propane. In addition to eliminating the diesel exhaust, these buses are noticeably quieter for riders and our community. These five new buses will now give us 19 propane buses in total, nearly half of our fleet. These bus purchases were made possible by the 2013 Permanent Improvement Levy passed by the community, as well as a \$135,000 Grant from the state of Ohio the NCCS received in the fall of 2022.

Routes and bus stops will be posted online on the Transportation page on the NCCS website. However, parents are strongly encouraged to use the Ride 360 app. This will have up to date bus stop times as the year progresses. Bus routes are approximate until we see exactly who is and is not riding. As we get into the fall and certain students do not ride, routes do not take as long to complete and times will adjust accordingly.



Traversa Ride 360 Mobile Application Guide

To access student routing information through the Traversa Ride 360 mobile app, do the following:

- 1) Download "Traversa Ride 360" from the Google Play Store or iTunes.
- 2) After the installation is complete, open the mobile app.
- 3) When you're asked to find your school district, search for the name of the school district your child attends. If you need assistance, please contact your school district.



- 4) Once your district is selected, you'll be presented with the login page. If you don't already have a login, click "Register".
- 5) To register, enter your email address, along with your password and name.
- 6) After registering, you'll receive an email confirmation. The provided link will require you confirm your registration through the Ride 360 website.



- 7) Login, and then add your child by going to My Students and choosing the + button. This will present the Find a Student screen.
- 8) Enter the unique information provided by your district to find your child. Repeat this step to continue finding students.
- 9) When all children are added, you can then view transportation information for each of your children.
- 10) If you'd like to share a student link with another person, go to My Students and either long-press for Android, or left-swipe for iOS.
- 11) Choose which students to share, then enter the email address of the person you'd like to share with. That person will receive a confirmation email, which will then automatically link the student to that user. They will be required to register with Ride 360, if they haven't already done so.

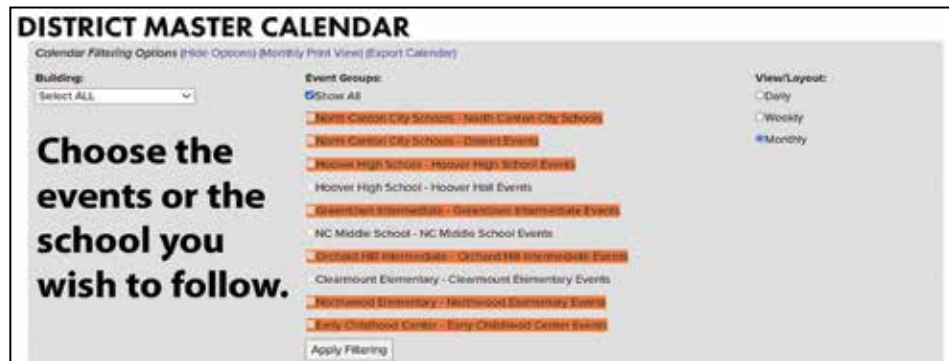
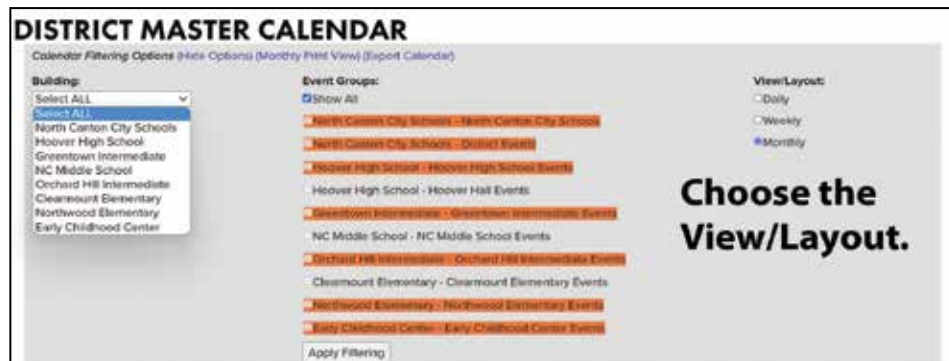

Online Safety

Keeping our students safe online is a high priority for North Canton City Schools. Several years ago, we adopted a web filter system called Securly. Securly adds an extra layer of protection on our devices while in our buildings on our network as well as when they are outside of school hours on other networks. With the Securly app, parents are able to see student activity and control accessibility while they are on their home network.

Securly sends alerts to school administrators when students perform searches or send emails with inappropriate or unsafe keywords. It also blocks them from unsafe and/or inappropriate websites. We already have layers of filtering through our internet connections at the state, regional, and local levels, but Securly adds that extra layer of filtering even when the device leaves our school network.

There are instructions for parents at <https://www.northcantonschools.org/One-to-OneInitiative.aspx> that show

how to set up and use the Securly app. Look for the "Securly Instructions for Parents" link on the right-hand side of the page. Visit <https://www.securly.com/home-parent> to learn about some additional features including the ability to pause devices or set offline schedules. Setting offline schedules allow parents to render a device unusable during set times (e.g., Monday through Friday offline from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.).

Teachers also use Securly Classroom to monitor students' screens, freeze or share screens, and push URLs to student devices. We encourage teachers to use this tool in creative ways to enhance their teaching, to monitor student progress, and keep the focus on learning. Teachers can send class-wide announcements, pull up an individual student screen to provide feedback, or share that student's screen with the rest of the class as an example. Students can virtually "raise their hand" to get the teacher's attention.

We have found Securly to be a valuable tool for teachers, parents, and students.
