

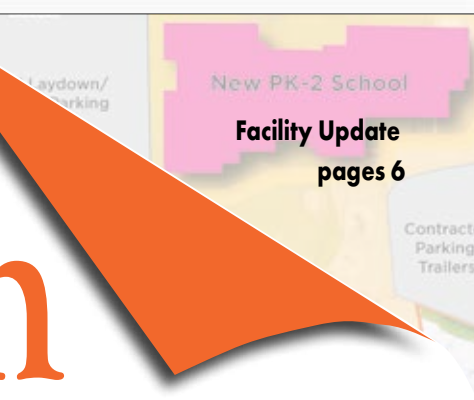

Before discussing the new year, I want to thank the many individuals who made enormous contributions to our school district and students over the summer. Our Food Service Department prepared over 60,000 meals for our kids, providing two meals a day since June 1. Our custodial and maintenance staff cleaned buildings, made repairs, and maintained our properties. These good people perform quietly behind the scenes, make sure that our schools can operate in a safe, healthy way. The Transportation Department worked hard to make sure our buses and other school vehicles passed the annual safety inspection. For the first time, the department transported students to summer school. Many of our teachers worked this summer in programs designed to provide intervention to students who needed additional instruction that would help them achieve greater success in the new school year. Our administrators spent much of the summer interviewing candidates for over 40 certified and classified positions. This process is extremely important to continue our tradition of excellence. Thank you to all these individuals who make NCCS a great place for kids.

Probably the most asked question we are asked now is about masks. Face coverings are not required for the 2021-2022 school year. ## Hoover's finlit named National JA Company of 2021

On Thursday, June 24, the teen entrepreneurs of finlit, a Hoover High School JA Student Company, representing Junior Achievement of North Central Ohio, were selected from among 15 JA student companies as the JA Company of the Year while participating in Junior Achievement's (JA) 2021 National Student Leadership Summit (NSLS). The competition took place virtually. Finlit is the third JA company from Hoover High School in four years to receive this recognition. Members of finlit are CEO Gavin Williams, Angel Arimia, Brandon Granitsas, Aaron Pike, and Brad Smith.

Finlit's mission is to instill financial literacy in every child and empower them with the skills they need for a successful future. In addition to winning the JA Company of the Year title, the teens representing the first-place student company were each awarded a \$3,000 JA Company of the Year Scholarship. All scholarships were awarded by the Achievement Foundation.

Junior Achievement's National Student Leadership Summit is a contest of business skills, ingenuity, and innovation that focuses on the accomplishments of the U.S. JA Company Program® students, ages 15-19, during the 2020-2021 academic year. JA Company Program® students start and run a real business enterprise under the guidance of a volunteer from the local business community. They devise and market a product or service that fills an unmet consumer need and recruit investors for their company.

Acting as company spokesperson, CEO Gavin Williams accepted the awards. "My team has played a huge role in this. Every single one of them have been absolutely integral in this team's successes and I'm so fortunate to have worked with them all this time. We worked so hard to make this product a reality and it's become something larger than I could have imagined. We had the experience

### One-to-One with Chromebooks

When remote learning happened suddenly in 2019, many districts were caught off-guard because they did not have a way to work digitally with students. In North Canton, we were very prepared with the technology we have in place.

A one-to-one program means every student and every teacher has a device that connects to the Internet and allows for digital schoolwork. Having portable devices allows our students and staff the flexibility to take their devices with them, thus extending teaching and learning beyond the walls of our classrooms. Grades K-2 have Chromebooks in carts in their classrooms, while grades 3-12 students carry their Chromebooks with them in protective cases.

Managing a one-to-one program can be challenging, but over the years we have developed a system that works well. A great deal of credit goes to our district librarians as they are the heart of the buildings and are instrumental in taking care of our students' digital needs. Student Chromebooks are

inventoried in our library system and are treated the same as a library book. They are checked in and out to individual students so that we maintain a history of our students and the devices in their possession.

When students experience a problem with their device, they take it to the library for evaluation. If the librarian determines that a device needs repair, they check that device back in and check out a replacement device to the student. That Chromebook is then sent to the Technology Department at the District Office where it is further evaluated. Based on the issue, it is either repaired in-house or sent to our insurance company for repair. After it returns, it is then distributed back out to a building library to be kept as a loaner or replacement. There is a continual loop of technology flow among the buildings.

The logistics involved in managing almost 5,000 devices is incredibly complicated. It is the people who make the process work, always with the intent of limited educational downtime. Our building librarians, our technology staff, and our courier are in constant communication and motion. We are incredibly lucky to have so many people who care about and support our students and our staff daily.

## Nidy Earns the Certified Education Technology Leader® (CETL®) Credential

On May 28, 2021, Kimberly Nidy, Director of Technology for North Canton City Schools earned the Certified Education Technology Leader® (CETL®) designation by passing a rigorous certification exam.

The CETL certification, awarded by the Consortium for School Networking (CoSN), signifies that Mrs. Nidy has mastered the knowledge and skills needed to bring 21st Century technology to our K-12 schools and other education organizations.

"Earning the Certified Education Technology Leader certification demonstrates a commitment to bringing 21st Century learning to our schools and other education organizations. Because of the CETL recertification requirements, certified leaders pledge to stay current in this ever-changing field of education technology," said Keith Krueger, CAE, Chief Executive Officer of CoSN.

To become certified, the candidate must have demonstrated experience in the education technology field and pass a comprehensive examination based on the 10 skill areas in CoSN's Framework of Essential Skills of the K-12 CTO. Once the CETL certification is earned, the education technology leaders ("ETLs") must complete 60 hours of professional development activities every three years to maintain the designation.

The CETL certification is awarded by the Consortium for School Networking. Founded in 1992, CoSN is the premier professional association for school system technology leaders and its mission is to empower educational leaders to leverage technology to realize engaging learning environments. CoSN is committed to providing the leadership, community, and advocacy tools essential for the success of these leaders.

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## Additional Supports in 2021-22

Thanks to federal stimulus funding that the North Canton City School District has received, the district will put several new supports in place and will extend some that were previously in place to address learning loss that resulted with many students due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Below is a list of the new and additional supports that will be in effect for the entire school year and most likely for the 2022-23 school year as well—all paid for by federal stimulus funding:

- Each of the 11 reading specialist positions that already existed in the K-5 buildings will increase from 4.5 hours per day to 5.75 hours per day. The additional 1.25 hours per day will result in more than 200 hours of instructional time for each of the 11 specialists, or approximately 2,400 total additional hours of instruction collectively. This additional time will allow them to spend more time providing reading intervention to students who have identified reading gaps both in a small group setting and by going into classrooms and working collaboratively with the core classroom teachers.
- Every K-5 building in the district, the middle school, and the high school will each now have one full-time math specialist who will provide math intervention to students in both a small group setting as well as by going into classrooms and working collaboratively with the core classroom teachers. This will be the first time that such a position has existed in the K-5 buildings and in the high school. Additionally, the one part-time math specialist position that previously existed at North Canton Middle School will increase from 4.5 hours per day to 5.75 hours per day.
- Hoover High School will now have a full-time reading specialist for the first time (no reading specialist position in the past) to provide intervention in English Language Arts to students while the part-time reading specialist position that previously existed at North Canton Middle School will increase to a full-time position.
- Northwood Elementary School and Clearmount Elementary School will share a part-time gifted intervention specialist who will teach the second grade students in the Junior Galaxy Program. This addition will allow the two existing gifted intervention

specialists who serve third through fifth grade students at Orchard Hill and Greentown to remain at their respective buildings all day and dedicate more time to the students that they already serve in the Galaxy Program at each of their respective buildings.

- The district will have one additional school psychologist compared to last school year. This will reduce the number of students that each of our existing school psychologists works with, which was very high compared to area districts, and will allow our school psychologist to each have more time to work directly with teachers and students to assist in prescribing and monitoring the progress of academic interventions for students.
- The district has added a new coordinator position that will help lead the intervention efforts with teachers and school psychologists to close the learning gaps that have resulted for many students because of the ways that the pandemic impacted teaching and learning for so many students.

The district is grateful for the federal stimulus funding that it has received and plans to continuously monitor the impact of these new

supports and continually reevaluate to make sure it is providing the best possible support to all students.

## Race and Diversity Course

Critical Race Theory (CRT) has become a controversial subject over the past year, although it has been an academic topic for at least 40 years. In our polarized country, people are debating what CRT means in the classroom. In essence, the question is “Does it unite or divide students based upon skin color?”

In the North Canton City School District this fall, Hoover High School will offer a new course, *Race and Diversity in America*. This course came about because of requests by students and parents. A survey of Hoover High School students indicated much interest and resulted in the high school offering two sections of the course, one each semester. The course description that was given to students before they submitted their course requests is listed below. The new course is an in-depth study into race, religion, and ethnic diversity in our country, and the content reflects the Ohio state standards for American History.

We believe that history should be taught impartially with a balanced curriculum that does not choose one political side over another. We believe that students should understand how the government works and how they can be a part of the decision-making process. We believe that all students, all humans, should be treated equally under the law and that all should have the right “to pursue life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.” These are not politicized beliefs. These are beliefs that form the foundation of our country in our effort to unite, not to divide.

### Race and Diversity in America

This semester-length course will examine the history of race and diversity in America. Students will gain an understanding of the roles that race and diversity can have in our society. This class will expose students to the changing cultural diversity within the United States, discuss racial and ethnic relations, and examine religious diversity and the history of racial segregation.

## Fueling our Future One Meal at a Time

What a summer for the NCCS Food Service Department! From June 1 to July 23, we fixed a total of 60,312 meals, serving nearly 800 children each day. We’ve provided meals for our NCCS summer school kids, athletes that are in summer workouts, Camp Adventure kids, YMCA Camp kids, YMCA Child Care Center kids and families in the community! And we’ll continue through August 13. On August 13, kids will receive a five-day meal pack to get them to the first day of school.

Through a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) program, ALL North Canton City School students will continue to receive FREE meals, regardless of household income. Students who are attending school are eligible for one free breakfast and one free lunch each school day. Students in all buildings have been offered school breakfast and school lunch at no charge since the program became effective in September 2020. North Canton City Schools Food Service Department will be reimbursed for the meals by the USDA with funds appropriated.

Menus can be found on the school district website ([www.northcantonschools.org](http://www.northcantonschools.org)) under Departments, Food Services, then Menus. Second entrees, extra milk and additional ala carte items are not free under this program.

If your family is eligible for free or reduced-price meals and you have not filled out a free and reduced meal application for this school year, we encourage you to still do so. Even though your children will continue to receive free meals, the state and federal governments use our percentage information to provide additional funds to schools for all students. These benefits may include Title I funds for reading programs for K-8 students, advanced placement testing, and other student programs. 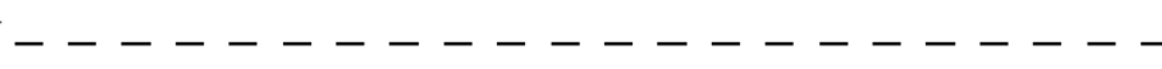

**PUBLIC MEETING**

**Federal Funding for Students with Disabilities**

North Canton City Schools will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, August 11, 2021, from 5:15 - 5:45 p.m. in Hoover Hall located 525 7th Street, NE. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss federal funding which supplement programs for students with disabilities (IDEA-B funds). Parents and community members are encouraged to attend.

**Child Find**

Each year school districts throughout Ohio participate in an effort to identify, locate and evaluate all children with disabilities, birth through 21; for age birth to 3, an established condition known to result in delay or documented developmental delay; for ages 3 through 21, identification of one or more of the following conditions: Autism Spectrum Disorder, developmental disability, deaf-blindness, hearing impairment including deafness, intellectual disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, emotional disturbance, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury and/or visual impairment including blindness. Parents are not always aware that there are programs and services available for children identified with a disability.

If you know of a child who may have one or more of the above suspected disabilities, including preschool age children, please contact the Special Services Office at (330) 497-5665.





# COVID FAQs for the 2021-2022 School Year

Updated July 22, 2021

Please be aware, however, that these plans are subject to change. We will notify you of any changes through the website and emails. Thank you for your patience.

**Will face coverings be required in school?**

Face coverings are not required for the 2021-2022 school year; however, face coverings are **recommended** for students and staff that are not vaccinated while indoors. Face coverings are **required** on all school transportation vehicles according to a federal mandate.

**Are students under age 12 required to wear masks?**

No. Students under the age of 12 are subject to the same guidelines listed above. Face coverings are only **required** on school transportation.

**Are vaccinations required of students and staff?**

No, vaccinations are not required.

**Will students or staff be required to disclose if they have been vaccinated?**

No, students will not be required to disclose that information.

**Will periodic testing be required for individuals who are not vaccinated?**

Testing will not be required.

**Will the dashboard be continued on the district website?**

We are awaiting a decision on the dashboard from Governor DeWine and the Ohio Department of Education.

**Will the district notify parents/**

**guardians of students who have been exposed to someone who contracts COVID?**

We will follow applicable requirements regarding notification and tracking of positive cases.

**How long must a student or staff member who contracted COVID remain isolated before returning to school?**

For most persons with COVID-19 illness, isolation and precautions can generally be discontinued 10 days after symptom onset and resolution of fever for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medications, and with improvement of other symptoms.

**Will school activities and sporting events be open to the public?**

Yes, school activities and events will be open to the public. Once again, face coverings are recommended for individuals who have not been vaccinated.

**Will the Viking Online Academy be available this year?**

No.

# CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS



## Construction activities on the new K-2 and 3-5 schools will be starting very soon!

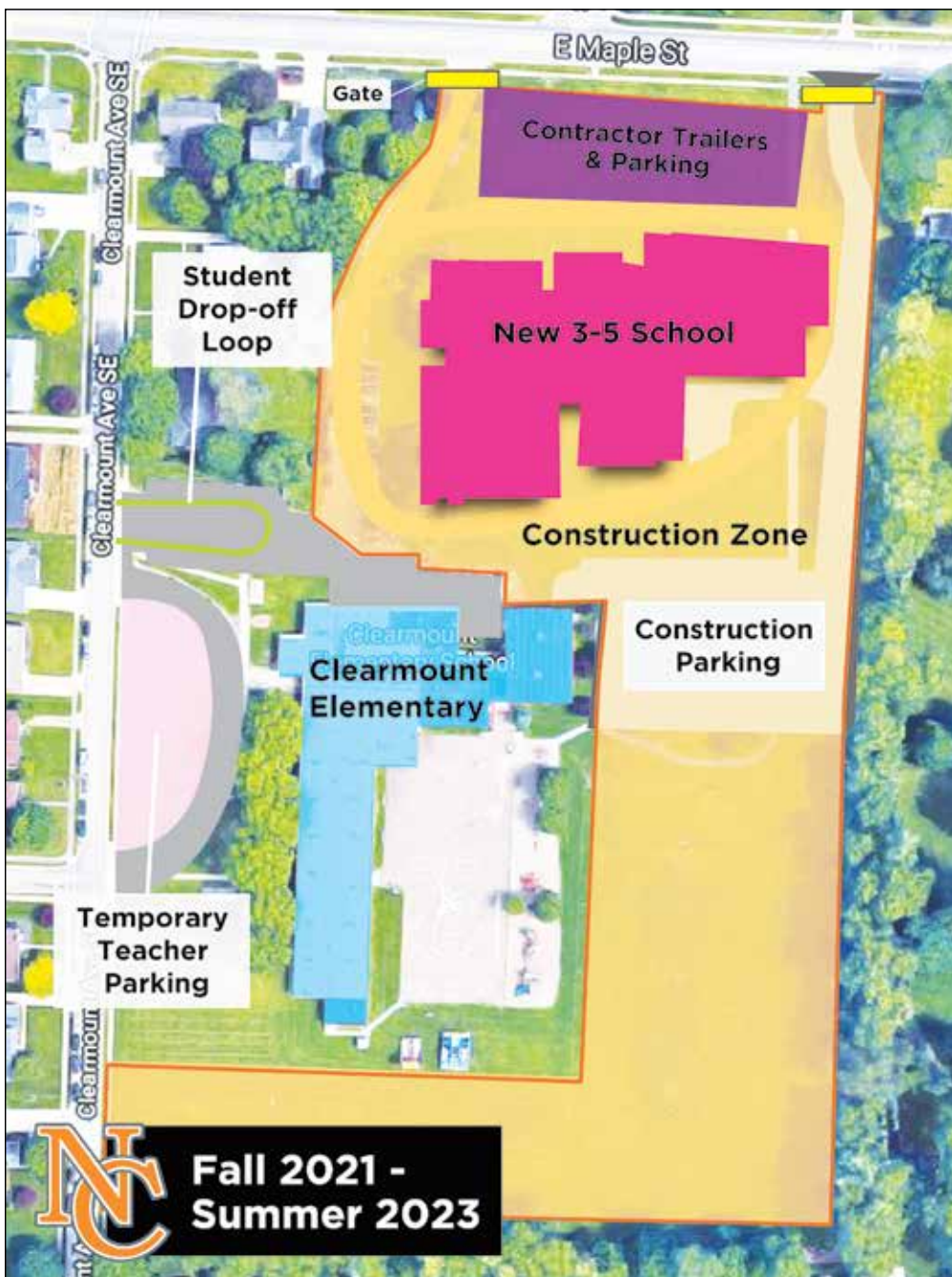
This fall, Hammond Construction will begin mobilizing equipment on site to start the early site package at both the Charlotte Street and Clearmount Elementary building locations.

The purpose of an early site package is to prepare the building area for construction of the new school. This involves putting up storm water controls, including silt fence and catch basin protection, in order to maintain drainage on site. Contractors will also grade the soil where the future building footprint will be constructed. Heavy machinery will be used to strip the topsoil and grade the land. Some of the topsoil will be stockpiled on site for later use in the final grading, and the remainder will be permanently removed. Construction fencing will be placed around the perimeter of the work site for safety and security reasons. Completion of the building pad is expected by the end of this year.

An early site package allows the project to get a “head-start” on the building construction. The site will be graded and ready to go so contractors can hit the ground running in the spring after winter weather has passed. When construction begins again in early spring of 2022, work will focus on installing footers and foundations for the buildings. Each school will take about 18 months to complete construction, with the grand opening scheduled for the start of the 2023-24 school year. The district, along with our construction manager, Hammond Construction, has developed a detailed site logistics plan for all phases of the building projects. Hammond is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for students and staff throughout the process. Hammond’s safety plan will include proactive measures to segregate construction activities from district operations with both fencing and signage.

Throughout the course of the project, the design and construction team will continue to engage the community and North Canton students through community updates and photos. We look forward to this exciting endeavor for our community and students!

## Hoover Career Tech Recognized

Hoover High School offers many great opportunities for students, and one of the most impressive aspects is the variety of courses students can take. Among them is a plethora of career technical education courses, some of which can be chosen as early as eighth grade. Our Project Lead the Way (PLTW) programs include courses related to engineering and biomedical sciences. PLTW recently gave us another **distinguished high school award**, and Hoover is one of 204 high schools throughout the country to earn this recognition. In fact, Hoover High School has earned this recognition for four consecutive years. Only 37 other high schools across the country have earned this award for four consecutive years, and Hoover is the **only** Ohio high school to be named a **PLTW Distinguished High School** for four consecutive years. Any student who is contemplating a career in the engineering or medical fields should carefully consider taking one of these PLTW courses, which can be begun in a student's freshman, sophomore, or junior year.

# Hoover Students Believe in Ohio

Funded by the State of Ohio through the Department of Higher Education and operated as a program of **The Ohio Academy of Science, Believe in Ohio** is a STEM and entrepreneurship program that teaches students how to commercialize products and services and create business plans that are driven by innovation.

Recently, 110 students from 17 high schools throughout Ohio competed in the second of two Regional Competitions for the opportunity to advance to the 2021 Believe in Ohio State Competition. Student projects are developed and then evaluated either as a STEM Commercialization Plan or a STEM Business Plan. The Believe in Ohio State Competition will take place in late June where they will compete for \$250,000 in total scholarship awards.

“STEM and entrepreneurship are a powerful combination that can be used to innovate commercialized solutions to problems as a market-based opportunity,” said Michael E. Woytek, Executive Director for The Ohio Academy of Science. Woytek went on to add, “these students are the future professionals needed to propel Ohio’s innovation economy.”

Each of the students advancing from the Regional Competition will receive a \$1,000 scholarship to attend any Ohio college, university, or technical college and the opportunity to compete for a \$10,000 scholarship at the State Competition.

Believe in Ohio is a free, comprehensive, curriculum-based, STEM and entrepreneurship program for Ohio high school students. The program is designed to create a “Culture of Innovation” and to prepare students to meet the demands of a rapidly changing labor market and become contributors to Ohio’s innovation economy. Believe in Ohio is a program of **The Ohio Academy of Science** and was collaboratively developed with **Entrepreneurial Engagement Ohio**. Hoover High School will be offering esports, short for electronic sports, as a club team for the 2021-2022 school year. Culinary Arts teacher, Phil Ogilvie, surveyed Hoover students last year and 250 students expressed a desire to participate. Ogilvie described the respondents as “a good mix from all areas of the school,” including athletes, band and choir members, theater kids, and students who don’t participate in any other school activity. “Surprisingly the students were split 50/50 in terms of gender.” To meet amateur status to participate, students must not have earned \$1,000 or more in prize money from esports competitions.

For those individuals who still think of electronic games as a waste of time, high school graduates are being rewarded for their gaming skills with college scholarships. Area colleges, such as Kent State, the University of Akron, Ashland University, and Mount Union University, have developed esports programs for their students.

The club team will participate through ESPORTS OHIO, an organization designed by educators

for students. The organization offers competition in eight different games, including Rocket League, Overwatch, and Fortnite. Each game specifies the number of team members along with an alternate. “We should be able to have room in the club for about 70 students each semester,” Ogilvie estimated. Ogilvie and Jessica Zettler will be co-advisors of the club. Competitions are available in the fall and the spring, and they plan to limit students to only one season because of the overwhelming number of students who wish to participate. Students will compete after school and use the ten computers housed in the publication’s classroom. “A very nice teacher offered to allow the club to share the Viking View’s computers,” explained Ogilvie, referring to wife Rachele Ogilvie’s willingness to open the space to the gamers. At this time the club will not permit spectators, but they may be permitted in the future if logistics can be worked out to show the computer screen on televisions.
