809 to 303 = 3.8 Means We Need Your Help

You may be thinking to yourself, "What in the world does this article title mean?" Let me explain. Prior to the pandemic in the 2018-19 school year, there were 809 registered substitute teachers through the Stark County Educational Service Center. This is the pool of people that the North Canton City School District and almost all the Stark County school districts use to acquire substitute teachers when teachers have to miss school due to being sick or their immediate family members being sick or due to attending workshops, conferences, or training session in an effort to gain new knowledge to help them improve teaching and learning. By the 2020-21 school year the number of registered substitute teachers was down to 554 and by the 2021-22 school year the number had fallen to 303. So in three years, the number of registered substitute teachers in the Greater Stark County area had decreased by almost 63% from 809 to

Students and educators all over Stark County and certainly here in North Canton from preschool through high school bore the brunt of the impact of this decrease in substitute teachers. Prior to the pandemic, it was very rare for a teacher who was missing school to not have a substitute teacher in their place. However, from November 2020 through May 2021, the North Canton City School District averaged 3.2 teachers per day without a substitute in its K-12 classrooms, and during the recent 2021-22 school year, that number increased to 3.8 teachers per school day without a substitute. This increase over the past year in classrooms without substitute teachers was common across all of Stark County even though almost all Stark County school districts, including North Canton, raised their daily pay rates for substitute teachers.

So, what happens when there are classrooms without substitute teachers? One option is that schools resort to piece-mealing the coverage of the teacher's classroom hour by hour or period by period by pulling teachers from their daily planning time, which means that teachers who are used in this way do not have adequate time to plan for their

teaching for that day, to collaborate with their colleagues, or to evaluate student work. Additionally, when this is the solution, the students in the classroom lack consistency on that day because multiple teachers are filling in for the absent teacher. Another option is that school counselors, principals, reading and math specialists, intervention specialists, or gifted intervention specialists will serve for some or all of the day as the substitute. When this happens, those individuals are pulled from their normal responsibilities, and in the case of the reading and math specialists, intervention specialists, and gifted intervention specialists, it results in students who would normally be receiving additional small group intervention or enrichment instruction to miss out on that service for that particular day. Lastly, another option is to combine classes by adding the students without a substitute teacher to another teacher's class or by dividing the students who do not have a teacher into two or more groups and combining each of those groups of students with other teachers' students. When this last option is used, the receiving classrooms increase in size significantly and maybe even double in size, which certainly is not optimal for teaching and learning.

So back to the 3.8 classes per day without a substitute teacher. If we estimate a student day to be seven hours, over the course of the 170 days students were in school during the 2021-22 school year, our district had 4,495 hours that students were without a substitute teacher. Imagine the impact that had on teaching and learning! WE NEED YOUR HELP! If you are someone who has a bachelor's degree, then you are eligible to apply for and receive a substitute teaching license from the state of Ohio. If you are someone who had a teaching license, but it has expired, the state of Ohio will allow you now to apply for a reinstatement license that is good for one year, and during that year you can substitute teach, or even obtain a regular teaching position in your certification area. So, if you are someone who has a bachelor's degree or an expired license and are available for only one day per week, five days per week, or any number of days per week, you can greatly help the North Canton City School District by becoming a substitute teacher. If you choose to

Ohio Blended Collaborative Impactful

For the past six years, North Canton City Schools has participated in the Ohio Blended Collaborative (OBC), which is a year-long professional development experience designed to help participants grow in understanding, implementation, and lesson design to support blended, personalized learning practice. North Canton was one of the original districts involved in launching the collaborative that started with districts in Ohio that were using Schoology as a learning management platform. The idea was that we could easily collaborate between districts and build shareable content using this common technology tool. We engaged an organization called ConnectingEd to come on as coaches and the collaboration has grown every year since it began.

We have ten teachers signed up to participate next year with 120 other teachers from ten other school districts around Ohio. Since it began, over 550 Ohio teachers have participated.

There are three different options that include a year one and year two experience with a newly added coaching experience for those who have completed years one and two. Examples of session titles include:

- Why is Lesson and Unit Design So Important?
- How Do We Put Students in the Role of Knowledge Constructors?
- Students as Active Learners and Authentic Users

- How Do We Know Learning is Happening?
- How Do We Begin to Give Students Some Control Over Pace of Learning?

Some comments from teachers who have been involved in OBC:

- "Blended learning does not mean JUST technology. There are so many aspects to the framework that you might already do and not know it! I really enjoy the sessions. It has helped me to be a better creator for my new curriculum and have more meaningful learning opportunities for my students."
- "My units that I have applied what I have learned in this course are some of my best units. The students are engaged and successful in these units."
- "I really enjoyed my experience. I am a more effective teacher because of it.
 I have learned a lot and I have access to so many new resources!"

All the participants agree that the opportunity to collaborate with other teachers is the biggest benefit of their involvement in the OBC. They share ideas, give and receive feedback, and grow together toward providing deeper and more meaningful learning experiences for their students.

The United States Department of Agriculture has not extended the meal waivers that were enacted to allow schools to provide delicious, nutritious meals for our students and the children in our community at no charge to families during the pandemic. As we transition back to full-pay school meals for the 2022-2023 school year, it's vitally important to us that all eligible students receive the help they need to continue to be well nourished and ready for learning every day. To determine if your students are eligible for free or reduced-price meals, you are required to fill out the application, which is available at this https://payschoolscentral.com. Paper applications can be picked up at the district office starting July 1st.

*Please note that the Free and Reduced-Price Meal application must be completed every school year starting in July and you can reapply as often as needed throughout the year if household income amounts change.

It's more than just a meal application! Did you know that if your family qualifies for free meals that you may also have your school fees waived? In addition, every qualifying student generates state and federal government funds which will benefit all our students and schools?

Since celebrating the groundbreakings last September, construction crews have mobilized and commenced work on both project sites. The new Intermediate School (Clearmount Site) for third through fifth graders and the new Primary School (Charlotte Site) for preschool through second grade are making progress towards a grand opening in 2023.

This past spring, construction crews completed work on the early site preparations for both schools. This involved site demolition including clearing of all topsoil with preliminary grading, placing storm water controls to maintain proper drainage, installing temporary construction haul roads, and installing the bulk of the underground site utilities. Contractors also graded and stabilized the soil where the building footprints are evolving with the current placement of foundations and masonry bearing walls.

Work over the coming months will focus on completion of the foundation systems, masonry bearing walls, and building underground utilities. Some of the first areas you will see come out of the ground include the gymnasiums, fire separation walls, and elevator shafts. Construction is progressing as scheduled to have all masonry bearing walls and 1st floor concrete slabs in place by the time steel is delivered towards the end of the summer marking the next major phase of

All construction is currently on schedule and on budget. We look forward to welcoming you to our new schools for the 2023-24 school year.

Hearing my students' pride as they shout, 'Miss Hauritz I did it!' or 'I am so proud of myself!' is the most rewarding and cherished part of my job as a teacher. Through my students' wide smiles and confident strides, I am able to witness their personal growth and success. Being able to witness such an impactful moment for my students is by far the most rewarding and memorable experience for me as their intervention specialist."



Research demonstrates that students who receive support for social and emotional learning in schools do better academically, socially and behaviorally. Students and teachers can use this room to relax, read, color, draw, play with sand therapy or draw on the giant chalkboard. The TAM Room is a quiet, relaxing space for all to use. Within the TAM Room, we encourage staff and students to use the room for exercise and wellness. There is a yoga corner, exercise balls, exercise weights, two exercise bikes as well as a treadmill. Students can go to the room under the supervision of a school counselor, teacher, or another staff member. Our hope is that the TAM Room will help to develop Social and Emotional Skills in our students so we can further meet the needs of the whole child.


