## Message from the Superintendent: Jeff Wendorf

In a few weeks we will kick off the 2018-2019 school year. Last year was difficult for the schools and communities in Stark County as we saw a drastic increase in the number of suicides by young people and a growing fear about violence in our school buildings. As a result, we have invested in more security measures that will help us lessen the threats to our children's safety. As with any tragedy, we have learned lessons through these difficult times. One of the most important lessons is the realization that we must keep our focus on our kids and on our relationships. It's easy to get caught up in test scores, athletic events, and all the other aspects of a school district, but especially at this time, we need to consider what we can do to better serve our students as individuals. This year we are kicking off two programs, Link Crew at Hoover High School and WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) at North Canton Middle School, in an effort to create a culture where every student is valued, where every student has a peer who will provide both guidance and support. While we realize that these programs will not solve every challenge schools have faced over the last year, we do believe they will help build a stronger foundation for our kids and our community. We appreciate your support of our schools, and we look forward to working together for the kids of North Canton City Schools.



attendance, discipline rates and course failures for last year's freshman class, and we will continue to track this data for future years. We believe this data will help us determine if the program is improving the climate of our building."

"It's about building a positive environment for all students," explains Hoover Principal Eric Bornstine. "One of the important aspects of Link Crew is assisting students in building relationships with their peers."

The middle school program is called WEB (Where Everyone Belongs), and it is a transition program that welcomes sixth-graders and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their middle school experience. The program is built on the belief that students can help students succeed and trains mentors from the eighth-grade class to be WEB Leaders. All sixth-graders will be introduced to the WEB program at their orientation Thursday, August 16, from 8:00 a.m. until noon at North Canton Middle School. In addition, parents of sixth-grade students will meet in the cafeteria from 11:00-12:00.

NCMS Principal David Eby is excited about the program because he believes

it changes the culture of the school building by making it student-centered. "It sets the tone for day one of their middle school experience. Sixth-graders will have a mentor to lead them through their first year of middle school, which we feel is important. We've learned over the years that some kids are more likely to reach out to a peer for advice than an adult."

Assistant Superintendent Dave Pilati believes the success of the program will be enhanced by the implementation of the middle school program, WEB (Where Everyone Belongs). "The short-term impact will be good, but it will be exciting to see the long-term impact these two programs have on our school culture about four years down the road after we have students who have gone through both the WEB program as eighth-grade mentors and then through the Link Crew program as ninth-graders who are mentored and then a couple years later as eleventh-grade mentors."

All freshmen, middle school, intermediate school and elementary school students will start school Wednesday, August 22. Upperclassmen at Hoover High School will begin school Thursday, August 23.

## New Student Mentorship Program at NCMS and Hoover

North Canton City Schools is implementing a new student mentorship program for ninth-graders and for sixth-graders. The high school program is called Link Crew. Link Crew is a high school transition program that welcomes freshmen and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their high school experience. Built on the belief that students can help students succeed, the program trains mentors from junior and senior classes to be Link Crew Leaders. This year the program will be directed by Mr. Mike Grady and 70 upperclassmen who will be present the first day of school for freshmen, Wednesday, August 22. Upon arrival

at school, freshmen will gather in the commons area of Hoover, and they will be called to the gym for introductions and group activities. The freshmen will later be divided into teams of 10-12 and led to classrooms by two mentors for small group discussions. The day will also include opportunities for students to meet their teachers and become more confident and comfortable with the high school setting.

Associate Principal Tom Oakes says the program will include several more activities throughout the year. "Hoover High School is committed to the long-term success of Link Crew in our building. We have compiled data on

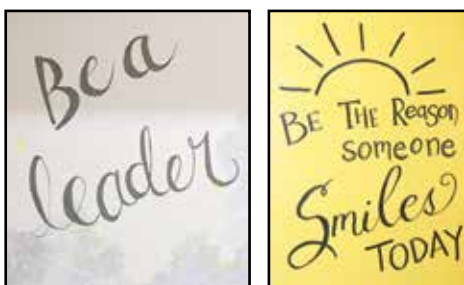

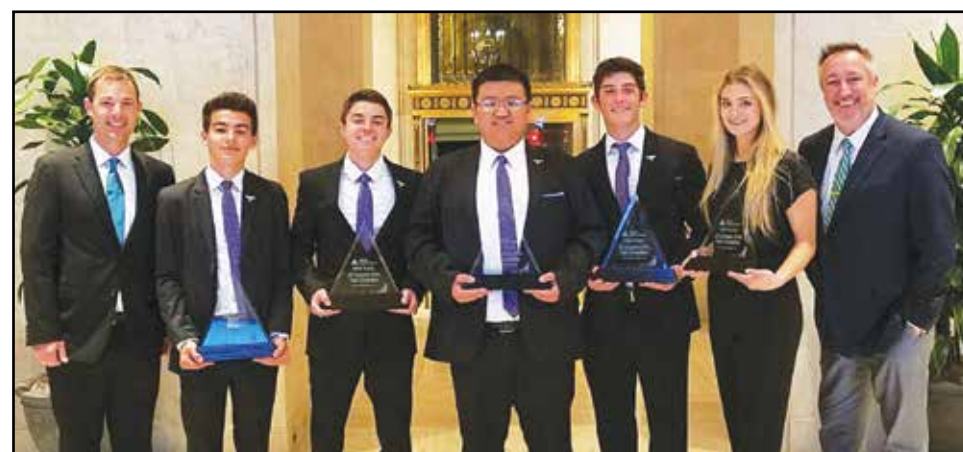
including Hoover students and Tom Wilson. The ODE is thrilled with the results of our series.”
