

Elementary School Remote Learning Framework

Between 8:00 a.m. and 2:20 p.m. M-F, the daily recommended schedule will include an hour-long instructional block for both Math and ELA, and a thirty-minute instructional block for science/social studies. This will occur through live google meets. Instructional blocks will be a blend of live meets, mini-lessons and independent offline tasks. Specific schedules per grade have been developed. The mathematics block includes calendar time, math workshop, and math games. The ELA block includes a reading workshop, writing workshop, word study, and grammar. Instructional schedule will begin September 8th.

Special Areas

Elementary special area teachers will develop grade-level choice boards. Students will select one item per special area choice board per week (i.e. one from PE, one from Art, one from Music, one from Library). Students must provide evidence of work completed. The grading system for special area classes will remain the same.

Attendance

Remote Learning attendance is required, the teacher will take attendance daily via live Google Meets.

Special Education Accommodations

- Special Education and general ed teachers will collaborate to provide specific accommodations to students as outlined in IEPs.
- All accommodations and/or services will be provided to students as outlined in 504 plans.
- Psychological Evaluations
 - School Psychologists will conduct evaluations in a face-to-face model using safety protocols.

Assessment

Teachers will use multiple types of authentic assessments (formative and summative). Teachers in similar grades/subjects will set up common grading procedures.

Grading

Grades PK - 2nd - Grading system will remain on the four-point scale that it is currently used in a traditional school setting.

Grades 3 - 5 - Grades will be based on traditional numerical scale. There is a minimum of one graded assignment and a maximum of three graded assignments per week per content area. Major assignments will be released/assigned with prior notice of the due date.

Technology

The District is purchasing devices for students in grades 2-12 as well as teachers using SSBA funds. These devices will not be ready until mid fall, in the meantime devices will be available for signout upon request. For students in kindergarten and first grade who need access to a device, those cases will be assessed and signed out on an as needed basis. The District will provide students with direct instruction on how to connect with teachers using Google Classroom. WiFi will remain available in the school parking lots and the district will purchase hotspots to help families living in connectivity dead zones or with limited bandwidth in their home service. Families may contact the school if the device becomes inoperable.
