HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

Homebound instruction is a service provided to students who are unable to attend school due to medical, emotional or disciplinary problems. Secondary students receive instruction for two hours per day and elementary students receive one hour per day. Students will receive credit acceptable completion of for their work while on homebound instruction, as determined by the student's classroom teacher.

The district makes provisions for homebound instruction upon referral from the Medical Director or the Director of Special Education following the guidelines established by the Superintendent of Schools for placing a student on homebound instruction. Homebound instruction will be evaluated quarterly with parent, administrator and medical director collaboration.

Homebound instruction will strive to keep the student on pace to rejoin his/her class and maintain academic progress. The Board recognizes that students who are out of school for extended periods of time are at risk of falling behind academically and/or losing connection to the school community. The Board directs the administration to evaluate periodically whether homebound instruction is effective in keeping students on track to graduate, and if not, to take steps to improve instruction and implement approaches and/or offer services that support the transition back to school.
