HONOR ROLLS POLICY

Honor Rolls will be established for all students in Grades 3 through 12.

The purpose of the Honor Roll is to acknowledge and reward the effort and success of our students.

The Honor Roll will be published after each academic quarter by the Building Principal.

Students shall be eligible for Honor Roll status based upon the criteria outlined in the Regulation attached to this policy:

ELEMENTARY GRADES 3-6

PRINCIPAL'S HONORS

A student will receive Principal's Honors upon attaining a current quarterly average of 89.5 - 100.0. All students will be eligible for Principal's Honors on the same basis.

HONORS

A student will receive Honors upon attaining a current quarterly average of 84.5 - 89.4. All students will be eligible for Honors on the same basis.

PRINCIPAL'S HONORS, HONORS

The following areas of study will be considered when determining the quarterly averages and eligibility for Principal's Honors and Honors in grades 3-6.

- 1. Reading
- 2. Mathematics
- 3. Science / Health
- 4. Language Arts*
- 5. Social Studies

NOTE: Language Arts may include English, Grammar, Literature, Vocabulary, Spelling, Library Skills and Handwriting.

A Passing mark for grades 3-6 is SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT

The quarterly average will be determined by adding up the five areas of study and then finding the sum. Divide this grade by 5.

The Honor Roll will be published quarterly by the Principal of the building.

Regular Education Students receive their grades from the classroom teacher.

12-1 and 6:1:1 students will receive their academic grades from the Special Education teacher for subjects taught by the Special Education teacher. Subjects taught by the regular classroom teacher will be graded by the regular classroom teacher:

The Honor Roll will be published with only the name of the student appearing on the list and shown under the name of the classroom teacher. The Honor Roll will be listed in alphabetical order when disseminated to the newspaper. Names will be listed on the school bulletin boards starting with students having the highest average.

HONOR ROLL REGULATIONS

SECONDARY GRADES 7-12

HIGH HONORS

A student will receive High Honors upon attaining a current quarterly average of 89.5 through 100.0. All students will be eligible for Honors on the same basis.

HONOR ROLL

A student will receive Honor Roll status based upon attaining a current quarterly average of 84.5 through 89.4. All students will be eligible for Honors on the same basis.

Students names will be listed in alphabetical order when disseminated to the newspaper. Names will be listed on the school bulletin boards starting with students having the highest average.

SECONDARY GRADES 7 - 8 HIGH HONORS, HONOR ROLL

Passing, for grades 7 and 8 is SIXTY-FIVE PERCENT.

The student's teacher assigns a grade for each subject in which the student is enrolled.

In grades 7 and 8 all courses of study are included in the calculation qualifying a student for High Honors or Honor Roll Status.

SECONDARY GRADES 9 - 12 HIGH HONORS, HONOR ROLL

Passing, for grades 9 - 12 is SIXTY-FIVE PERCENT.

Each student will be enrolled in the equivalent of five (5) units of instruction.

In grades 9 - 12 all classes meeting daily will be included in the calculation qualifying a student for High Honors and Honor Roll Status.

Only students working toward a High School Diploma will be included in the class ranking. The State Education Department has ruled that an Individual Educational Plan (IEP) Diploma is different from a High School Diploma in that it is not an indicator of successful completion of a High School Course of Study.
