ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS TO SCHOOLS

Resident elementary and secondary students, eligible to register and attend the schools of the district, shall be enrolled at the elementary school located nearest their legal residence. The district shall, when necessary, transfer elementary students to maintain an economically sound school system.

Students requiring individualized educational programming or services shall be assigned to the appropriate program, within the district. Any such assignment shall keep in mind the best interests of the student and have the approval of the Building Principal, Director of Special Education, as necessary, and the Superintendent of Schools.

Students who have a change in residence within the district boundaries may be required to transfer from one elementary building to another. In general students not residing in the former Champlain Elementary School zone (flex zone) should attend the school located closet to their residence. Parents may request in writing, a continuance at a particular elementary school provided the following conditions are met for review:

- 1) Parents agree to transport and sign Transportation Release form.
- 2) Grade level class size (district-wide) is not negatively impacted.
- 3) The student has already attended a particular school for more than 50% of their elementary school years.

Other parents requesting a specific elementary building must apply annually in writing to the Superintendent by April 15th. The criteria (1-2) list above will apply.

The final decision will be rendered by the Superintendent of Schools. Bus routes will not be altered to make an accommodation. Continuances, which are granted, must be reviewed and approved annually. High school bus transportation is not available for elementary students.

Special Education self-contained students who were transferred to a particular building for a specific program, and who no longer require that program, may be returned to their elementary building of origin. Factors to be considered in this review will be.

- 1) Grade level class size district-wide
- 2) Parent recommendation
- 3) Teacher Recommendation
- 4) Bus transportation
- 5) Successful mainstreaming of one (1) school year

The Superintendent will render a timely decision based on these factors, seeking input from the Director of Special Education and the Building Principals.
