

## STUDENT AUTOMOBILE USE

The school district, in order to promote responsibility for safe, orderly and efficient transportation of its students, authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to establish rules and procedures for the transportation and supervision of students to and from the school. Board of Education policies, Commissioner's Regulation, Department of Motor Vehicles Regulations, Department of Transportation Rules, and school insurance requirements are considered in the establishment of administrative procedures relating to the transportation of students.

Only seniors, with permission slips from their parents, may be allowed to drive their own vehicles to and from school. Other students may be allowed to drive their vehicle to and from school with parental permission authorization from the school Principal. Students are not authorized to transport other students to and from school. They may transport siblings with written parental permission. Students found to be in violation of this rule shall have their driving privilege revoked.

The speed limit on school premises is not to exceed ten miles per hour.

Students driving any motorized vehicle to school are to obtain a student sticker from the Senior High School Principal's office prior to driving to school.

Student vehicles must be kept locked all day and the school sticker is to be displayed on the lower right corner of the rear window. The school district assumes no responsibility for the theft of a motorized vehicle or contents therein from school premises.

Students authorized to drive to school are to park their vehicles in designated areas only.

Students driving vehicles to school shall be released only after the buses have all departed from the school parking lot.

All special requests relating to driving privileges shall be presented to the Senior High School Principal for his approval.

Students shall not be permitted the use of faculty or staff cars during the school day for any reason.
