


A Peanut

Toot! Toot! Peanut butter!




An Old Man

"Sayonara!" said three.


"Aloha!" said four.


"Good-bye!" said five.

Table Manners


The Goops they lick their fingers,

Oh, they live disgusting lives!


The Goops they talk while eating,

Of elephop and telephong!)






Something in My Pocket

It's a great big happy smile.




Hullabaloo


I raised a great hullabaloo
