- Marin County Parcel Tax Summary 2023-2024 (dated April 24, 2024)
 - We don't have the inflationary factors on this, so the per-parcel amount hasn't changed. We also have not gone out to a vote to change it.
 - Those who live within multiple district zones pay both.
 - We can visit the inflation in future years.
 - Bring to next meeting: there may be a potential parcel tax policy change.
 i.e. community-led needs 55% passing vote; if it's District-led, it needs 66% passing vote.
 - TM: We can compare our numbers to San Rafael, who receive two parcel tax through Elementary and High School Districts.
 - TM: Would there be a benefit to splitting into two Districts like San Rafael? Probably not.
 - o TV: How would this affect negotiations?
 - JB: Currently: NFT president is also lead negotiator.
 Elementary and Secondary negotiations are very different.
 - Average funding per district per student can be found on EdData.org
 - Compare cities and their taxes parcel, bond, property, sales, etc.
- Parcel Tax Financial Summary Report 2023-2024
 - Provides a full breakdown of revenues and expenditures.
- Parcel Tax Update 2023-2024 Unaudited Actuals (UA)

- TV: Why is the ending balance now 0?
 - JB: Things have gotten more expensive. We could be at the same level of support as a decade ago.
 - DG: When we knew what was coming in, they projected for the term of the parcel tax measure. They left a savings amount in case things increased over the term.
- We pay our teacher salaries out of "quad zero" that's tax/LCFF money.
- Parcel Tax revenue has gone up slightly. This could be caused by new developments, change of ownership on properties that previously had an exemption.
- If it's a multi-family property, they only pay one parcel tax (i.e. 700 units, only one parcel tax of \$251).
- Parcel tax doesn't take into consideration the valuation of your property like property tax does.
- Exemptions to parcel tax can be found in the voter information guide.
- TV: Do we know if we have any new developments?
 - JB: We've heard of a few, but the biggest might be developing our own through the Employee Workforce Housing, although nothing has been officially decided on.
- Impact Mitigation/Developer Fees: Does the District still get those fees? Yes, and it goes into Fund 25.
- Go to the city to build an ADU, give them blueprints and plans. Take it to city per square foot over 500 sq ft. New process: come back after you're done for the right to occupy permit, then pay the fee.
- City has the ability to add additional fees if it affects water and sewage not District. District is straight square footage.
- On a new building it's the footprint, if it's single residence then it's square footage of livable space.
- Money can only be spent on Facilities new parking lot at San Marin High School due to increasing student enrollment, decreasing number of available parking. More people living there is causing an impact, use impact fees.
- We projected 6,954 ADA and we are at 6,955. Enrollment is closer to 7,300.
- Policy, Voter Information Guide, and Ballot Language was included in packet.
