School Policies

Absences

State law permits absence from school only for personal illness, illness or death in the family, impassable roads or unsafe travel due to inclement weather, religious observances, religious instruction (up to one hour per week with a parent's written request), quarantine, required presence in court, attendance at health clinics, alternative educational activities including attendance at school-sponsored activities, personal reasons upon confirmation by parent/guardian and with approval by the district, or such other reasons as may be approved by the Commissioner of Education.

Please notify your child's school as early as possible when you know that your child will be absent by calling these phone numbers:

Calling early enables teachers to be notified and prevents your child's absence from being marked as illegal. Homework is posted on Google Classroom (Vernon and OBMS/HS) and Seesaw (TR). Homework can also be requested in the morning for pickup after school. A written note is generally required upon a student's return to school.

Daily attendance is important for educational progress. In addition, state aid is based on total attendance each school day.

Bus Transportation

The District provides universal bus transportation for all K-6 students and all 7-12 students who live .50 miles or more from their school. Distances, by law, are measured along the nearest available public route between home and school.

A bus pass is sent to all eligible students at the end of August. When a two-hour delayed opening due to inclement weather is announced, the morning bus schedule, as well as the start of the school day, will be revised. For example, if a student usually boards a bus at 7:20 am, the pickup time would be 9:20 am.

If your child leaves an item on the bus, the Hendrickson Bus Company may be called at (516) 628-1800.

Emergency School Closings

When there is a need for a two-hour delayed opening, or schools must be closed due to bad weather, announcements will be made on the District website, www.obenschools.org, News 12 Long Island, WNBC-TV, WABC-TV, FOX5/WNYW and the following radio stations:

WBAB 102.3 WCBS-880 AM WHLI-1100 AM WINS-1010 AM. Families should also expect an automated phone and/or text message from the District.

When regular school is canceled due to inclement weather, afternoon and evening programs are also canceled.

Immunizations

All students entering 7th and 12th grade must have the meningococcal vaccine. Without it, they cannot attend school. New York State enacted legislation regarding the required immunizations for school entry. Please view this link to see the age-appropriate dates and doses required for school entry: www.health.ny.gov/prevention/immunization/schools. Students who do not meet these requirements will not be allowed to attend school. For further information, please contact the Health Office at your child's school.

Medications

Students are not permitted to carry or self-administer medications, homeopathic remedies or over-the-counter medicines without special permission from a doctor and parent. Forms can be found on the Parents & Students (Health Services tab) page of the District website. State law prohibits schools from dispensing medication unless a written order is received from both parent and physician. All medications must be contained in the original prescription or nonprescription bottle.

Physical Examinations

Physical and dental examinations are required for all students entering grades Pre-K, K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11 and all new entrants at any grade level. Examinations must be completed within 12 months of the first day of the school year. These must be submitted within 30 days of entry to school or 30 days of entry to designated grade level. The 2023 NYS form is the only form that will be accepted. It can be found on the District website on the Health Services tab under Parents and Students.

Physical examinations are also required prior to participation in interscholastic sports for students in 8th, 10th and 12th grades. This examination is best done by your family physician but can be conducted by the school physician. For more information, contact the Health Office of your child's school. Forms can be found on the Athletics and Parents and Students pages of the District website.

Health Screenings

New York State Education Law requires that students receive screenings as part of the school health services provided by each public school district. School nurses will conduct screenings. If the results of the screening indicate that your child requires further follow up, you will receive written notification.

Asbestos Reinspection

The District has complied with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, AHERA [40 CFR 736.85(E) (B)], by completing the following requirements:

- 1. Reinspecting all buildings and spaces for all asbestoscontaining building materials.
- 2. Sampling previously untested building materials suspected of containing asbestos.
- 3. Updating the Management Plan.

The reinspection results and the updated Management Plan are available for review in the Main Office of each school or in the Office of the Deputy Superintendent, located in the Administration Building.

Integrated Pest Management Program

The Oyster Bay-East Norwich Central School District has adopted an Integrated Pest Management Program in accordance with New York State Education Department regulations. This program dictates that the least toxic pesticide be used only when absolutely necessary. Any student, parent or staff member may register to receive written notification 48 hours prior to a regulated pesticide application. Individuals may request their name be added to the school registry at any time during the school year. Release of Student Directory Information Under the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

The District has the option under FERPA of designating certain categories of student information as directory information. The Board directs that directory information may include a student's name, name of parent/guardian, address, telephone number, date of birth, major course of study, participation in school activities or sports, weight and height if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, most recent school attended, grade level, photograph, email address and enrollment status.

Under no circumstances will social security numbers or other personally identifiable information be considered directory information.

The District herewith gives notice of intention to provide, release or publish in the District newsletter or bulletins, school or student newspapers, magazines, yearbooks or other publications, daily or weekly newspapers, athletic programs, musical, theatrical or award programs, news releases, videos, social media, websites and school-related organizations, any or all of the aforementioned directory information pertaining to students.

Under the Regulations of this Act, parents, guardians or students over the age of 18 who do not desire the release of any of the above information must make a specific request in writing to the superintendent by Sept. 15, 2024. Once the student or parent/guardian provides the "opt-out," it will remain in effect after the student is no longer enrolled. Students who opt out are still required to have their student ID cards with them at all times that they are on school grounds or attending a school-sponsored event. Failure to make such a request shall be deemed consent to release, provide or publish the directory information during the 2024-2025 school year.

The District may elect to provide a single notice regarding both directory information and information disclosed to military recruiters and institutions of higher education.

Records Access

Parents or lawful guardians have the right to view their minor child's permanent records upon an appointment with the principal or authorized staff member. Students under 18 years of age have the right to inspect their own records without parental consent. Students who are 18 or older, or who are high school graduates, have the sole right to examine their own records. For more information, please see the Board of Education's policy book located on the District website.

Parent Conferences

Regularly scheduled parent-teacher conferences are arranged in all schools. Additional conferences may be requested by school personnel in certain circumstances. Parents are encouraged to request a conference if they feel there is a need. This can be done by calling the Main Office at Roosevelt and Vernon, or the Counseling Office at the High School.

Registration for Grades 1-12

Students in grades 1-12 who are new to the District can register in person in the Administration Building. Please call the registrar at (516) 624-6555 for information and to schedule an appointment. Registration documents in English and Spanish are available on the District's Central Registration page at www.obenschools.org.

Registration for Kindergarten

Your child may attend kindergarten in September 2024 if he or she is 5 years old as of Dec. 1, 2024. The physical and dental examinations required for entrance should be obtained preferably during the summer before school starts. Immunizations must be completed before school begins. Please bring proof of residency (such as a tax or utility bill) and proof of your child's age. Registration documents in English and Spanish are available on the District's Central Registration page at www.obenschools.org.

Registration for Pre-Kindergarten

The District offers a New York State-authorized and approved full-day pre-kindergarten program at Roosevelt Elementary. Your child may attend pre-kindergarten in September 2024 if he/she is 4 years old as of Dec. 1, 2024. A lottery is held each spring for eligible students who have registered with the District. Additional information about our lottery and registration documents in English and Spanish are available on the District's Central Registration page at www.obenschools.org.

Nondiscrimination Policy

The District does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origins, sex, religion, creed, marital status, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression and transgender status. For grievances, contact Maureen Raynor, Deputy Superintendent.

Use of School Facilities

Application forms for use of a school building and/or its grounds may be requested from the Buildings and Grounds Office at (516) 624-6556. Completed applications should be returned to the Administration Office at least two weeks before the date requested.

Voter Registration

You may register to vote in District elections in the Administration Building, Theodore Roosevelt Elementary School and the James H. Vernon School during regular business hours. The last day to register to vote in the District election is May 15, 2025.

Special Notifications

No Child Left Behind

Parents and guardians may request specific information as to the qualifications of their children's teachers and paraprofessionals, according to the mandates of the No Child Left Behind Act. This information includes the following:

- Whether the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree, major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether a child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

To request this information, please contact the Superintendent's Office in writing.

Safe Schools

In accordance with Project SAVE (Safe Schools Against Violence in Education) legislation, the District has developed three plans, as follows:

- Early Release (when students need to return to their homes and family as rapidly as possible) Special students' needs will be identified and planned for appropriately. At no time will elementary school students be returned to unoccupied, unsupervised homes.
- Lockdown (when individuals are required to remain within the safety of their immediate areas to protect them from imminent danger) – School buildings have been surveyed to identify the safest areas for occupants.
- Evacuation (when a building's inhabitants need to be moved to another site) Plans include provisions for transportation and use of alternate sites.

During the school year, all school buildings will conduct drills for each one of these plans.



School Services

Athletics

Physical education is mandated by the State. The District provides an adaptive program for students certified by a doctor as being unable to participate in regular physical education activities.

In addition to regular physical education classes, the District provides a variety of extracurricular sports for grades 7-12. Included are badminton, basketball, baseball, bowling, cheerleading, crew, cross-country, fencing, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, sailing, soccer, softball, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling. Students must have a physical examination prior to participating in such sports.

Cafeteria

Lunch and breakfast may be purchased at each school. Snacks also may be bought. A complete menu, with prices, is sent home each month with your child and is posted on the District website.

Free and Reduced-Price Lunch and Breakfast

Free and reduced-price lunch and breakfast are available to students whose families meet various financial criteria. Information and application forms on this program are either mailed or sent home with all students at the beginning of the school year. They can also be obtained from the Administration Office and the District website, www.obenschools.org. Applications are confidential. For more information on our cafeteria point-of-sale system and prepayment options, visit www.obenschools.org.

Working Papers for Students

State law requires that students under the age of 18 looking for employment have working papers. These papers are available in the high school Counseling Center.



Gifted Program

Atlantis is the District's program for gifted and talented students in grades 4-6. Students are tested yearly for eligibility and, if admitted, spend several hours each week in the program.

Special Services

The Oyster Bay-East Norwich CSD is committed to providing opportunities for all students to achieve excellence. The Office of Special Services focuses on supporting all students in the least restrictive environment and helping all students reach their highest potential.

Services and support may include specially designed instruction, as well as psychological and social work services, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy and physical therapy, and counseling. The Board of Education appoints the Committee on Special Education (CSE), the Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE) and the Subcommittees on Special Education, all of which are under the auspices of Special Services. These committees make recommendations to the Board of Education for specialized programs and services for children with special needs who live in or attend school within the Oyster Bay-East Norwich School District.

Special Education

The District provides a full continuum of educational services based on the individual needs of students, as determined by the Committee on Special Education (CSE). If you suspect that your school-age child has a disability, contact the school psychologist in your child's school or Department of Special Services at (516) 861-3200.

Committee on Preschool Special Education Services

If you suspect that your preschool child (ages 3 to 5) may have developmental delays, contact the Department of Special Services at (516) 861-3200.

Special Education for Private and Parochial Schools

Parents of students who have an Individualized Education Program (IEP) and who enroll their child in a non-public school (both private and parochial) where they are paying tuition, must notify the school district where the non-public school is located, in writing, no later than June 1 before the school year in which services are to be provided, that they are requesting special education services. This must be done each year.
