Primary Goals:

- -Develop an appreciation and understanding of American History and how it affects us now both as a nation and personally
- -Develop a working knowledge of American geography and its inherent effects on historical events (*Geographical Determinism*)
- -Pass the regents exam with a satisfactory score
- -To learn and apply basic research techniques
- -To read, write and discuss higher level concepts clearly

Resources:

- -Textbook and resources (as provided)
- -Video/movies
- -Primary sources (i.e. contemporary art forms as music, architecture, literature etc.)
- -Secondary sources- as provided
- -Class discussion
- -Internet/Library

Evaluation:

Students will have both reading and writing assignments supportive of the revised New York State social studies and language arts standards. It is imperative that these assignments are read or written in a timely fashion. The grading system will be based on the following:

Tests/quizzes 45% Homework/Projects 40% Attendance/Class participation 15%

- -Homework-when collected and graded (at the instructor's discretion) will count from one to three times depending on amount of work assigned
- -Homework- when not done or done to a minimum level will count as a zero for grading purposes equal to the weight if graded
- -Special projects weighted as announced
- -Class participation: You are expected to actively participate in class discussions, to ask questions as needed and be part of class interaction.
- -I am open to extra credit work <u>only if agreed to in advance</u>. <u>No such credit will be</u>
 <u>accepted within three days of the end of a marking period and students</u>
 <u>cannot receive extra credit if they are not turning their assignments in</u>
 regularly. Do not ask for exceptions.

Behavioral Expectations:

- -You <u>will</u> come prepared with your computer, notebook, appropriate text, completed homework, writing utensil, and you <u>will</u> be on time. Failure to meet these basic demands will result in a grade recorded of *zero* for that day's work. Further lack of preparation will demand parent involvement and possible detention at teacher's discretion.
- -No cell phones during scheduled class times unless approved by the instructor.
- -Clothing will be appropriate and in good taste. This includes wording, graphics <u>and allusions</u> to any subject or action in bad taste, profane or disruptive to the learning process.

Ethical Issues/Plagiarism: Taking credit for someone else's work is a serious breach of academics and Federal Law. Each student will be taught the exact meaning of Plagiarism and any violation of that expectation will mean an immediate zero in the assignment This includes homework, tests and any papers handed in for any assignment

-Behavioral expectations in this class can be summed up in one word.... <u>RESPECT</u>.. Respect for the room, its contents, the teacher, and each other, and, most of all, -yourself..
