There are a wide variety of COVID-19 symptoms that we all need to be aware of, so we are attaching a list of those symptoms. Please be aware that these could change, but they are accurate as of this mailing. It is a good idea to go to the CDC website (link in attachment) for the most up to date list of symptoms. These symptoms, if present in your son/daughter before school hours, will need to be reported to the school nurse so we can communicate with you on return to school protocols.

As I have said many times before during this ever-changing time in education, I truly appreciate all the support and understanding that the Prattsburgh community continues to display. It is very encouraging to know that we are all going through this together and we are all trying to do what is best and safest for all our students. Thank you again for being such an incredible community. As Mr. Floyd Farley used to say, "only in Prattsburgh!"

Parent Survival Guide for the 2020-2021 School Year

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	Responsibilities of the Parent or Guardian that must be completed at home.
FIRST thing in the morning	 Each family is required to take the temperature of every member of the house who will be attending school each day. This must be completed by all students and staff members. You will receive a text or email alert each morning asking you to complete the short survey; answering the temperature and COVID-19 related questions (see enclosed message on our new system VERY IMPORTANT) This must be done by each household before 6:30 each morning as our first bus leaves the garage at 6:30am. This step is very important for the health and safety of our entire school community. Please DO NOT send your child(ren) to school if they have a fever of over 100.0 degrees or if they are displaying any of the COVID-19 symptoms (see attached list).
My child is ill	If your child is not coming to school please call the nurse's office (522-6206) or email the nurse at doylek@prattsburghcsd.org and provide a detailed message stating your child's name, grade, teacher's name, reason for the absence, and specifically state any COVID-19 symptoms that are presented new to the student.
	All doors will open at 8:00am.
Arriving at School New this year	Students should go directly to their classrooms.
	All students must walk up to the school and enter wearing a mask.
	 BREAKFAST All students (K-12) will pick up their breakfast at they enter the building each morning. Students will enter through one of three sets of doors. Those entrances are: Loading dock doors (PreK-5) if arriving by bus Main entrance by the high school gymnasium is restricted to 6th-12th grade students Parent Drop-off 'up top. We ask that you DO NOT drop your child off early as their will be no supervision. Students WILL NOT report to the cafeteria. They will go directly to their classrooms. Once seated the students may remove their masks to eat breakfast. Students will need to put their masks on if they move from their seats (i.e. throw their trash away, use the restroom, move throughout the room)
LUNCH and RECESS	 All students will wash their hands before leaving the classroom to go to the cafeteria. All K - 12th grade students will go through the cafeteria line to make their food selections. All K - 10th grade students will eat at tables in the cafeteria that have been set up for social distancing. The 11th and 12th graders will eat in the high school gymnasium Once at the table the students may remove their mask to eat lunch but will need to put their mask on to leave the table to return their trays or use the restrooms. Recess There is no recess for grades 6-12. Recess for K-5 Is scheduled for the 20 minutes before lunch OR the 20 minutes after lunch depending on the individual class schedule. The monitors will alternate being on the playground and taking the student for walks around

	campus.
	 Please dress your students for the weather as they will be going outside every day unless it is raining
	or the temperature dips below 20 degrees.
	• All students riding the school bus must wear a mask for the entire trip to and from school or a school
BUS	event.
603	• Students from the same family can sit in the same seat on the bus and will social distance as much as
	possible.
	• Due to transportation restrictions/limitations NO BUS CHANGES can be made after 10am each day.
BUS PASSES	Only in extreme circumstances will this be approved on a case by case basis.
	• Please send your bus/pick up notes to school in advance and please keep the schedule as consistent as possible.
	If your child must leave school during the day please send a note to school with the student stating the date of the appointment, the time of the appointment, nature of the appointment and if you plan to
	return them to school after the appointment. This year all of this information is required.
EARLY	If the student is leaving school to go to the doctors for a well-child visit they would be welcome to return
DISMISSAL	to school after the appointment. If they are going to the doctor's because they do not feel well or they
	are going for a follow up from an illness they should not attend school before the appointment and it
	will be up to the nurse whether they can return after the appointment and will have to follow district
	'Return to School' protocol (See attached).
	Breakfasts and lunches are FREE for all students PreK-12.

	If you want your child to be able to purchase extras (i.e. ice cream, chips, cookies) the cafeteria is asking
	everyone to reduce contact between the students and the staff. The cafeteria lines will be cashless to
	the greatest extent possible. Online payment is encouraged. If online payment is not possible, checks
	can be sent to the district. Elementary Students may also bring in cash or checks in sealed envelopes
	with their name and teacher name on it to be deposited.
	At the secondary level, if students bring cash, any change will be applied to the student account. In the event a student must have change back, we will take steps to accommodate that request. Due to the
	national coin shortage and the effort to reduce touch points, maintaining our typical service level with

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of reported symptoms – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after exposure to** SARS-CoV-2. Symptoms can include:

- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat

- Nausea or vomiting

We do need a valid email address from you in order to use the Operoo system. Please share those details with us if you haven't already. If you don't have internet or cell service, please contact us at 607-522-3795 immediately so we can develop a different system.

You don't need to do anything else until you receive an email invitation from us asking you to sign up for your Operoo account. After that, you'll receive daily notifications to complete the screening for your child.

From our perspective, you or your child's information will only be visible by the relevant staff for you or your child and will be managed in accordance with our privacy policies.
