Annual Budget Vote

School Board Election, Prattsburg Free Library Levy Vote & Capital Project Referendum

Tuesday, May 21, 2024, Noon to 8:00 p.m. in the PCS Main Building Cafetorium

For the 2024-2025 school year, and for the sixth consecutive year, we are once again estimating a 0% tax levy increase. The proposed levy is \$61,960 LESS than the levy was in 2016-2017, and the rate per thousand dollars of assessed full value is projected to be \$10.57. This rate is one of the absolute lowest in the entire region. While the district is facing many uncertainties in projecting state revenues and rising expenses, the PCS Board understands all families are faced with the same uncertainties and made it a priority to keep costs down for district residents.

This year we are proposing a budget that is a 4.75% increase over the 2023-2024 fiscal year. New York State has projected an increase in Foundation Aide to PCS of \$14,400 over what we received last year. Since nearly 70% of our funding comes from state aid, this is certainly tough news. However, the PCS Board has once again prioritized strategically using reserve funds to balance our budget instead of increasing the tax levy. This budget is very conservative and is an effort to keep costs down as much as possible. Just like last year, we are looking at increasing costs in ALL areas, but here are some of the major contributors:

- Utilities and fuel
- Employee benefits including health insurance and retirement system obligations
- Cost of BOCES services (however, PCS has a 75% BOCES aide ratio so we pay 25% for BOCES services after aide is received)
- Transportation costs for special education programming

For the past several years, we have been patiently waiting for the economy to settle and New York State to come through with appropriate funding for schools. At this point in time, neither has happened. We will continue to be fiscally responsible, while still providing the educational experiences that all PCS students deserve.

PCS is also proposing a \$22,200,000 capital project. This project addresses needs that were outlined in the state required Building Condition Survey. All these improvements can be done at no additional tax impact on our community. The use of \$1,000,000 out of our capital reserve and the utilization of state building aid make this all possible.

This capital project will take place over the course of several years and will be broken up into four (4) phases. At the state level, there has been much talk of updating aid ratios, and building aid will possibly be included. If we pass this project in May, our current aid ratios will be locked into current state law. With our building aid currently sitting at approximately 90%, it is vital to pass this project now and lock in for the entire scope of this project.

The Board of Trustees of the Prattsburg Free Library has determined to request that school district voters consider changing the 2024-2025 free library tax levy to \$90,380 from the amount of \$87,958 as established in 2022-2023. Please contact the Free Library for more information.

ANNUAL BUDGET NOTICE

The annual budget vote for the 2024-2025 fiscal year by the qualified voters of the Prattsburgh Central School District, Steuben and Yates Counties, New York will be held on **Tuesday**, **May 21**, **2024 between the hours of noon and 8:00 p.m.** prevailing time in the main building cafetorium at which the polls will be open to vote by voting ballot.

To **vote** you must be at least eighteen years of age, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of the Prattsburgh Central School District for at least thirty consecutive days prior to the vote. Identification and proof of residency may be required.

Applications for **absentee ballots** must be received by the district clerk at least seven days before the vote if the ballots are to be mailed to the voter or by the day of the election if the ballots are to be picked up in the district office. Questions regarding eligibility to vote by absentee ballot should be directed to the District Clerk, Mrs. Roxanne VanAmburg, at 607-522-6211.

Qualified voters will be asked to cast ballots on the following items:

- THAT the Board of Education of the Prattsburgh Central School District be and hereby is authorized to
 expend the sum set forth in the budget presented to voters on this date, to wit, the sum of \$11,970,023 and
 to levy the necessary tax therefore
- The election of one member to the board of education for a term commencing on July 1, 2024 and ending on June 30, 2029
- The election of one member to the board of education for a term commencing on July 1, 2024 and ending on June 30, 2027
- The election of one member to the board of education for a term commencing on July 1, 2024 and ending on June 30, 2026
- THAT the Board of Education of the Prattsburgh Central School District shall be authorized to levy taxes
 annually in the amount of \$90,380 for the Prattsburg Free Library to provide public library services and pay
 over such funds to the Prattsburg Free Library Board of Trustees
- THAT the Board of Education of the Prattsburgh Central School District is hereby authorized to undertake certain capital improvements consisting of addition to, and construction and reconstruction of the Main School Building and facilities, site and athletic field improvements and the acquisition of certain original furnishings, equipment, and apparatus and other incidental improvements required in connection therewith for such construction and school use, all at an estimated maximum aggregate cost of \$22,200,000; and to appropriate and expend from the existing capital reserve fund \$1,000,000 for such costs, and that the balance of such cost, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax to be collected in annual installments, with such tax to be offset by state aid available therefor; and, in anticipation of such tax, debt obligations of the school district as may be necessary not to exceed \$21,200,000 shall be issued.

^{*} The annual \$100,000 district capital outlay project will be used to provide new surface mounted shower kits in the girls' locker room showers, new surface mounted shower kits in the girls' team room, replace single use shower floor slab in the referee room, and replace the ADA shower kit in the referee shower. This expense is eligible for state aid next year in the amount of approximately \$88,100.
