APPROVAL OF PARTIAL ROOF REPAIR AT

SACHEM HIGH SCHOOL NORTH

AND MCCLAVE CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT, INC. AS

ARCHITECT/ENGINEER

Several months ago, McClave Construction Management, Inc. was hired to review the roofs at a few elementary schools and the roof at Sachem High School North. After reviewing the original contract documents, Brian McClave and John Wooten had extensive conversation with Genflex/Firestone. Genflex/Firestone agreed to make all repairs to three elementary schools at no cost to the District. In addition, Firestone Building Services will also supply 75" of metal edging that became unattached during the December 2010 wind event at one of the elementary schools.

Sachem High School North

During the inspection phase of all the roofs, the engineers discovered 12,000 square feet at Sachem High School North, fiberglass/gypsum board became soft. These soft boards are along the eastern perimeter of the science wings and around two fans. The soft board is an indication that moisture is entering the system. After negotiating with Genflex/Firestone, it was agreed Firestone would supply Sachem with 12,000 square feet of EPDM, recovery board membrane adhesives, all fasteners and flashing accessories.

Firestone will also provide insulation to replace any wet insulation. Genflex will not pay for the labor to install the new roof. It is the recommendation of McClave Engineering to bid the labor that Genflex/Firestone is not supplying for an approximate cost of \$75,000. This does not include the engineering fees to write a specification, create drawings and manage the project. This is an approximate cost of 10%. Therefore, the approximate cost is \$82,500. The funds will be taken from the Facilities 2012/13 general fund budget. This was discussed with Mary Anne Sadowski and she concurs with McClave's recommendation. It is recommended that the Board of Education accept the Firestone offer and attempt to get this work completed this summer.

It is also recommended that any additional materials be purchased through Firestone so Sachem School District will have a single source warranty on the Sachem High School North roof. Brian McClave will be at the Board of Education meeting to answer any questions the Board may have.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: "that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the McClave engineering report to provide the labor and materials at an approximate cost of \$75,000 for construction labor and \$7,500 for architect/engineer construction management fees for a total cost of \$82,500 for repairs to the Sachem High School North roof. It is further recommended that McClave Construction Management be approved as architect/engineer of the Sachem High School North roof repair project."

It is recommended that we utilize surplus 2009-10 funds for partial funding for emergency roof repairs at East High School. Therefore, it is recommended that we increase the 2010-11 Appropriated Fund Balance by \$2,700,000 and the 2010-11 transfer to Capital by \$2,230,000. I have spoken to both Mary Anne Sadowski at Ingerman Smith and Deborah Johnson, from the New York State Education Department, to ensure proper approval in declaring the emergency repair and related work of the East High School roof as a health and safety contingent expense. In the absence of voter approval, we need to inform the New York State Education Department of the deteriorating nature of the East roof so we do not jeopardize state aid on this project. Deborah Johnson gave tentative approval pending formal SED approval of the plans and specifications which are to be prepared by John Wooten/McClave Associates. The Board of Education needs to approve the following resolution which indicates sufficient funding for the partial roof replacement.

It is recommended that we increase the 2010-11 transfer to capital line which is included in the 2010-11 budget. We also need to increase the 2010-11 budget and we shall increase the 2010-11 Appropriated Fund Balance. The remainder of the excess fund balance of \$1,300,000 shall be used to lower the Tax Levy.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: "that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the emergency partial roof repair and related work of the East High School roof at an

approximate cost of \$3,200,000 to be accomplished during the 2010-11 school year.

BE IT RESOLVED: "that the excess funds from the 2009-10 East High School emergency repair be transferred to the 2010-11 East High School emergency roof repair in the amount of \$970,000 (transfer of \$970,000);

BE IT RESOLVED: "that the Board of Education increase the 2010-11 school year budget from \$280,711,665 to \$282,111,665; (increase of \$1,400,000)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: "that we will increase the Appropriated Fund Balance from \$14,313,313 to \$17,013,131; (increase of \$2,700,000)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: "that we will lower the 2010-11 Tax Levy by \$1,300,000 from the voter approved tax levy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: "that we will increase the transfer to capital line from \$877,000 to \$2,277,000; (increase of \$1,400,000)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: "that we increase the transfer to capital line \$830,000 and reduce 2010-11 Teacher Salary budget code for the East roof emergency roof repair

Any unused funds shall become part of the June 2011 Capital Fund Balance.

BOARD OF EDUCATION PRESENTATION ON GRUNDY ROOF

The architects and engineers would like to talk to the Board of Education regarding the emergency partial roof repair at Grundy Avenue Elementary School. We have had several conversations with Johns Manville to determine the specifications and requirements to reinstate the warranty. We have discussed the same with Mary Anne Sadowski, attorney at Ingerman Smith, and it is recommended that the Board of Education approve an emergency partial roof repair and related work at Grundy Avenue Elementary School due to the health and safety of the students. The estimated cost is \$150,000 for supplies and materials, including architect's fees and engineering. The excess funds from the East High School emergency repair will be transferred to the Grundy emergency roof repair. If you recall the Grundy roof was completed January 1, 2005 with a Johns Manville warranty for twenty years with a 72 mile per hour wind rider. Johns Manville suspended the warranty due to the following:

- 1. Moisture entering from the walls
- 2. Punctures in the roof
- 3. Moisture in light weight concrete
- 4. Wind event

The roof has been secured with sand bags during the last year. Brian McClave and John Wooten will be at the October 17th Board of Education meeting to answer any questions.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: "that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves an emergency partial roof repair and related work at Grundy Avenue Elementary School due to the health and safety of the students. The estimated cost is \$150,000 for supplies and materials, including architect's fees and engineering. The excess funds from the East High School emergency repair will be transferred to the Grundy Avenue Elementary School emergency roof repair."
