DECA Top 10 Medal Winner

Sachem High School North's Avi Talsania earned a medal for being a top 10 performer in the Automotive Services Marketing event at the DECA International Career Development Conference in Orlando, Florida. In this event, participants were challenged to perform marketing functions related to auto dealers, service stations and related businesses.
