Art 3A & 3B

### Purpose of the Course

Art 3 is designed for the intermediate- advanced art student. This course provides the artistically skilled student an opportunity to improve drawing and painting techniques and further develop expressive skills while creating original works of art. They will study a wide range of drawing and painting techniques as well as artists, movements, and history. The media used in this course includes watercolor, acrylic and oil paints, chalk pastel, charcoal, ink, pencil, and colored pencil. Emphasis will be placed on observational skills, learning new tools and experimenting with new techniques. This course aims to increase student awareness of art forms in past and present cultures throughout the world as well as develop visual literacy. Each unit is designed to develop aesthetic awareness and to connect and apply what is learned in the visual arts to other subject areas and careers. The Art 3 curriculum will integrate the National Core Arts Standards.

The course may be repeated for additional credits.
