Dear Anza Trail Families,

Happy March, Happy Spring! This month is filled with business and pleasure. From HS Credit Math Benchmark Formatives (February 26th-March 4th), Spring Break (March 16th-20th), and back to 3rd-8th grade AzM2 (formerly AzMERIT) Testing preparation (March 23rd-March 30th), and 3rd Quarter Parent/Teacher Conferences on 3/26 and 3/27 (both half days of school), our need for balance will never be greater. 3rd-8th grade AzMERIT testing is scheduled for March 31st-April 3rd with make-ups on April 6th, and AIMS Science Testing for 4th and 8th grades beginning April 8th through Friday the 18th (online testing window). To help you with your pursuit for balance, please keep in mind the following:

- Preparation for our standardized testing began on Monday, August 5th, 2019. Please continue to practice regular attendance and show your child that school comes first by trying to keep days off for illnesses and family emergencies only. Also, schedule routine doctor and dentist appointments for after school or over school breaks when possible.
- Explain that tests show your child how much he/she has learned. Encourage him/her to try their best, but don't put so much emphasis on them that your child feels stressed. It is truly one litmus test of their overall achievement.
- When supporting with homework, practice reading the questions at the end of a section first, and then read the passage. That will help him/her know what to read for as they find the answers. If possible, provide positive and constructive feedback to capitalize on your child's practice opportunities.
- Limit activities the night before tests. Be sure your child gets to bed on time or a bit earlier.
- On test day, give your child an energy-boosting breakfast. Try to include both protein (eggs, yogurt, milk, etc.) and carbohydrates (fruit, oatmeal, toast).
- Send your child with a healthy snack each day during testing week.
- 3rd Quarter Parent/Teacher Conferences will take place Thursday, March 26th, and Friday, March 27th. Both days are also half days of school with a 12:15 dismissal.

Lastly, my team and I wish you a restful Spring Break. May each day of your well deserved break bring you moments of relaxation and opportunities to make a lasting memory. ☺

Unfortunately, a combination of illnesses has been rough on all of us since returning from holiday break. As we are very busy in our days, it's super important that students be here as much as they can, and when they can't, it's imperative that they get caught up quickly. We understand that it's a lot of work, but students are only given one day for each absence to complete the work missed. This is one reason some teachers offer websites, so parents or students can check each day for the missing work and hopefully get caught up before returning, or quickly after. It is the student's responsibility to see the teacher to get their missing assignments or come in for tutoring if needed. Most teachers offer tutoring at least two days a week, if not more. CAREER & TECHNOLOGY

Level 1

6th, 7th and 8th Grade students begin their Quarter exploring career paths (high school/college) and the internal and external components of contemporary computer technology (desktops, cell phones, tablets, etc.). Students identify internal components (CPU, RAM, Motherboard, etc.), explore external connections (USB ports, HID's, Ethernet, etc.) and learn the fundamentals and importance of an Operating System (Windows, iOS, etc.). Students practice and explore Operating System Tools, Keyboarding (touch-typing) and the basics of electricity (Circuits, volts/amps, AC vs DC, etc.). All students explore the vocabulary and definitions for high school graduation (course credits, advanced placement, etc.) as well as investigate terminology used for developing a plan for college (Baccalaureate, Major, Scholarships, GPA).
