1. Christian Lawton – Art Presentation

Mr. Christian Lawton – SHS Art Teacher shared his art presentation. He created a project for his Art III students the inspiration was a book called "The Monster Engine" by Dave Devries. The concept was to take young students art work ages 3-7 and let them create their own creature. Mr. Lawton partnered with Ms. Barbara Tingle, Kindergarten Teacher at SPS and had her students create their own fantasy creature. Mr. Lawton then took the kindergarteners art work and had his students' project the original art work embellishes it and renders a watercolor. The final step was to take the 2D drawing render it in porcelain and make a sculpture. This is where the high school had an opportunity to do their version of the art work. The high school students kept the ceramic sculpture and the art work was returned to the kindergarten students. Mr. Lawton thanked Ms. Tingle and his students. Mr. Lawton's students were presented with a Certificate of Excellence.

Mr. Murphy asked if Ms. Tingle could share how her students' reactions when they received the returned art work. Ms. Tingle shared what a great experience this was for her students. Her students were inspired by the "big kids".

Mrs. Hall said that this was one of the most awesome collaborations.

Mr. Eves mentioned that one of the opportunities would be on the new bridge for Mr. Lawton and his students.

2. Ryan Carle & Christine Garcia – South Central Regional Music Festival

Dr. Valenzuela asked Mr. Carle and Ms. Garcia to give an update on the South Central Regional Music Festival and how their students were selected to participate. Mr. Carle explained that each student has an opportunity to audition. After the students register they are given three pieces of music they prepare. The students traveled up to the University Of Arizona School Of Music and compete against students from 30 other high schools in Southern Arizona. The student has to perform the music that they prepared as well as material that is presented to them on the spot that they have to read for the judge. It is a blind audition, so the judges are listening and scoring the students. Based on those results the students with the top scores for each instrument are selected to perform in the South Central Regional Music Festival. There will be nine students from our District that will be participating. All these students are eligible to qualify for All-State. Each student was presented with a Certificate of Excellence.

VIII. Superintendent Reports

The superintendent may present reports at this time.

Enrollment report shows no gain or loss. We have 5730 students that is a 5% increase from last year at this time.

Dr. Valenzuela shared photos of the Beyond Textbooks 2 day Training at WGHS. Mr. Bonner said that it has been a very positive transition process and look forward to full implementation next school year.

Dr. Valenzuela showed Pictures of the SPS Lighted School House. One of the unique things about all of our schools is how create the spirit of community and unity.

Dr. Valenzuela announced as part of the Strategic Planning and continuous improvement efforts in the month of March. The District will be initiating the OHI Survey – Organizational Health Inventory which is a standardized validated survey designed by Ohio State University, Dr. Hoy. This will be sent out electronically, will be marketed at all schools. This will help us see what we are doing well and also look at some performance targets. A letter will be sent from my office regarding the survey.

Dr. Valenzuela had an opportunity to present the National Math and Science Initiative to the Town Council Meeting. He was taken aback by a comment raised by one of the Council Members. Council Member Bracco, he acknowledged how amazing it was that we have been able to solicit that amount in private investment in a short amount of time over \$800,000. We will have site visits at our high schools next week.

Carondelet Health Organization Internship for 16 students to spend a day at the new St. Mary's facility.

Country Fair White Elephant Variety Show will be happening when we come back from Rodeo Break. This is a token of our gratitude for supporting our District.

Dr. Valenzuela reminded the Board of the Lunch at Sahuarita Middle School beginning at 12:55.
