#### **MINUTES**

#### REGULAR GOVERNING BOARD MEETING AND EXECUTIVE SESSION

March 28, 2007 – 6:30 PM – Sub Hall B – Sahuarita Auditorium 350 W. Sahuarita Road – Sahuarita AZ 85629

## I. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

President Thomas Murphy called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Also in attendance were Clerk of the Board Diana Kellermeyer, Board members Elaine Hall, Martin McGee, Michael Lurkins, Superintendent Dr. Jay C. St. John, Assistant Superintendent Dr. Manuel Valenzuela and Director of Business Services Charlotte Gates. There were 90 guests. The Pledge of Allegiance was observed

## II. Approval of Agenda

The superintendent recommended approval of the agenda as revised. The motion was made by Mr. Lurkins and seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

# III. Approval of Minutes – January 24 & February 28, 2007

The superintendent recommended approval of the minutes as published. The motion was made by Mrs. Hall and seconded by Mr. McGee. The motion carried.

# IV. Approval and Ratification of Vouchers

Mrs. Gates recommended ratification of previously approved payroll vouchers 17 and 18 in the amount of \$1,489,329.71. She further recommended approval of expense vouchers 7558-7561 in the amount of \$646,406.44. The motion was made by Mrs. Kellermeyer and seconded by Mr. McGee. The motion carried.

#### V. Call to the Public

Mr. Phillip Moreno, parent in the district. He attended an exciting meeting on the curriculum for the existing and new high school. It was an exciting presentation, and he commended the high school administration, district administration and governing board on their foresight.

Mr. Vern Butler, Building Committee Chairman of the Santa Cruz Valley Church. Mr. Butler expressed the concerns of the church on the impact of the access road off La Villita Rd. The right of way for this access road will be taken from land purchased by the church. Further information in agenda item VII.C.2.

#### VII. New Business

- A. Instruction Discussion and Possible Action

Dr. St. John recommended approval of the 2007-2008 teaching calendar as presented. The motion was made by Mr. Lurkins and seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

2. Return Control of LINK Program to SUSD 30 from Educational Enrichment Foundation

On advice of the district's auditing firm and legal counsel, Dr. St. John recommended the control of the LINK program be returned to Sahuarita Unified School District from the Educational Enrichment Foundation. The LINK personnel will become employees of the district with benefits. The program may continue to use the 501.3.C status of the foundation to write grants.

This is also a recommendation from the Educational Enrichment Foundation President, Elaine Hall, and the Board of Directors of the Foundation. The motion was made by Mr. McGee and seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

3. Addition of Kindergarten Class to the LINK Program

Dr. St. John recommended the Board approve the addition of a kindergarten class to the LINK program. The children in this class will come from the students on a waiting list. The additional cost to the program will be more than covered by the increased enrollment. The motion was made by Mr. McGee and seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

4. Report on Research Project with UA on Professional Development Needs - Dr. Valenzuela

The district recently collaborated with the University f Arizona in a research project designed to gather information about professional development needs. The study was very well conducted and the district had over 50% participation on the online, voluntary project when data was collected in the first semester of this academic year. Dr. Valenzuela presented a summary of findings to the Board. He introduced Ms. Lori Prucha, research associate, who assisted with the research project. She thanked the district for its support. The response rate is a great beginning for an on-going collaboration.

5. Noted Accomplishments and Special Recognition by SUSD Staff - Dr. Valenzuela

Dr. Valenzuela shared a list of noted accomplishments and special recognitions by staff and administration. We have much to be thankful for.

 Change of Date for May 23<sup>rd</sup> Governing Board Meeting – Conflict with Middle School Promotion

The traditional Governing Board schedule for May is in conflict with the Sahuarita Middle School promotion ceremony on Wednesday night, May 23. Dr. St. John recommended

that, unless there are pressing needs, this meeting be cancelled. The motion was made by Mrs. Kellermeyer and seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

## 7. Update on JTED – Dr. St. John

All eleven school districts in Pima County voted to participate in the JTED. It will become a new school district. Alex Jacome will serve on its board as a representative from Sahuarita Unified School District.

Dr. St. John shared the mission statement, guiding educational philosophy, delivery, criteria for enhancement of existing programs, criteria for new and emerging programs, TJED administration involvement and a draft budget. Mrs. Gates said our district share of the budget is just under \$300,000.

Mr. Murphy asked what the time frame was for say our culinary arts program to be the program for JTED for example. Mrs. Gates said the JTED has targeted July 1 to begin. The CTE directors have to turn in their information by April 23. Mrs. Kellermeyer was impressed with how quickly everything has come together.

## B. Personnel - Discussion and Possible Action

## 1. Increase in Personnel @ ECC Due to Increased Enrollment

Dr. St. John recommended the Board approve the addition of one (1) early childhood classroom assistant for 7 hours per day, two (2) early childhood aides each working three hours per day, five (5) substitute early childhood aides who would work as needed when other aides are out sick or on vacation and one (1) replacement receptionist who is leaving at the end of the month. The cost for the new positions will be covered by the operating costs due to increased enrollment. Mrs. Kellermeyer made the motion and was seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

## C. Business - Discussion and Possible Action

## Classroom Dollars and Proposition 301 Results

Dr. St. John presented the Board with information on the Classroom Dollars and Proposition 301 results. The district student/teacher ratio is rising, which causes concern. The average salary is still well below the state average. Our average years of experience in the district are also less than the state average. The dollars spent in the classroom continue to increase ever so slightly though we are just slightly below the state average.

## 2. Access Road from La Villita to SUSD Loop Road

Three years ago the Town of Sahuarita conducted and paid for a traffic study based on concerns of increased traffic from the school campuses on Sahuarita Road. The study determined there was too much traffic on Sahuarita Road and that the entrances to campus were too close together. The Town asked the district to consider an access road from La Villita to the district's loop road and budgeted \$750,000 for the road. The Town has since sold that parcel of property to the Santa Cruz Valley Methodist Church. Dr. St. John stated it is uncertain that the original problem still exists.

In response to a question from Mr. Murphy, Dr. St. John stated the district has already spent \$678,000 to close and/or to combine entrances/exits from the campus, and we are not done yet. With 800 students currently moved from the main campus to Anza Trail School, the volume of traffic on Sahuarita Road is not as heavy. An additional 400 students are due to move to Anza Trail in the fall.

The district's loop road was built for use by our buses and maintenance vehicles only. It is not built to public road specifications, is narrow and has drainage problems. The access road would open the loop road to civilian traffic, something that has been denied in the past and could create security issues for the main campus.

Mr. Vern Butler, representing the Santa Cruz Methodist Church stated the church purchased 6.6 acres of land from the developer. The usable acreage due to varying issues is down to three acres. The church feels it would be difficult to provided security to the church land and people if the access road is built.

Mrs. Kellermeyer stated all board members have been opposed to the access road whenever it was discussed. Town Planning and Zoning Commissioner Phillip Moreno stated that after he shared the Board's concerns with the other commissioners, the access road was dropped off their top five list of recommended projects. He urged residents to contact Town Council members to ask them to oppose the project.

Mrs. Kellermeyer moved to deny the Town the ability to build the access road from the loop road to La Villita. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lurkins. The motion carried.

3. Updated on Land Acquisition for New High School

Dr. St. John informed the Board that the district architectural firm, EMC2 Architects, has submitted land request (interim process) forms to the School Facilities Board in application for the acquisition of the land for the new high school located on La Canada. The Park Corporation is willing to sell acreage to the SFB for the site of the new high school and the future site of a K-8 school that has been conceptually approved by the SFB. The SFB could approve the purchase of up o 66 acres. There are no archeological sites on the property. Utilities, water and an access road are in place. There are a few Pima Pineapple Cacti that the Park Corporation will move to a site already selected. Dr. St. John will attend a SFB meeting next Thursday when preliminary action is expected on this issue.

The district is on the Capital Improvement Plan for Pima Community College to have shared space at the new high school by supplying a fully equipped computer lab for use by the students' daily and evening classes by the college. The community is seeking to establish a library locally. Dr. St. John visualized a library on the new high school campus that served the high school, the community and the needs of PCC. It is possible students could potentially graduate with an endorsement in library science. Dr. St. John recommended the Board pass a resolution in support of the community library with possible location on a future school site. The motion was made by Mrs. Kellermeyer and seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

 Approval to Enter into Lease Agreement for Procurement of Salinization for Two District Swimming Pools

Dr. St. John recommended the district enter into a lease agreement for procurement of Salinization for the Sopori swimming pool and the pool at the main campus. The district would enter into two contracts with E-konomy Pool through a third party agent for the purpose of leasing the equipment as either an operational lease or a lease purchase at the district's option. The cost of the Sopori lease is \$25,080 and the main campus lease \$\$23,643. Mr. McGee made the motion and was seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

- 5. Copper Hills Little League Use of Facilities
- 6. 49ers Youth Football Use of Facilities

In April 2006 the Board approved the use of district facilities by these two organizations for one final year only. The action caused much grief in the community. Dr. St. John asked high school teacher Joe Rieman to gather information on the use of the fields by local

teams. The situation has changed somewhat as we expected more competition to take place at Anza Trail School.

Dr. St. John requested the Board allow the Copper Hills Little League and the 49ers Youth Football use of the fields within reason if he and facilities director Daryl Rawson are comfortable with the schedule. Time has to be allowed for the maintenance on the fields. Mr. Lurkins made the motion and was seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried. Mr. Murphy stated the district wants to be here for the children. The frustration isn't with the organizations but with the Town to develop more parks.

Dr. St. John recommended approval of the policy revisions as presented. Mrs. Kellermeyer made the motion and was seconded by Mrs. Hall. The motion carried.

# VIII. Superintendent/Administrative Reports

Administrators presented written reports.

<u>Dr. Valenzuela</u>: He attended the SIS Career Day. It was a fabulous experience for the students. Many careers were represented and it was a wonderful community event. .

Mr. Huff: Mr. Huff informed the Board of the various interesting occupations some of his drivers held prior to their retirement and subsequent work as bus drivers for the district: electrician, director of sales for Portland Trail Blazers, purchasing agent for digital equipment corporation, police officer, owner of a printing company with 38 employees, talk show host, for 28 years, retired school employee maintenance department driving for 38 years, maintenance officer for Miramar Naval Base, service manager for large automotive dealership for 30 years, took and die maker, engineer for the federal government, heavy equipment operator Phelps Dodge for 32 years, research and development machinist Raytheon for 25 years, product manager Lucent Co. (AT&T) for 38 years, Imperial Bag and Paper Company Warehouse for 26 years, Phelps Dodge for 13 years.

DPS was on site the last two days doing bus inspections. One 16 year old bus failed inspection; the seal around the engine housing leaking.

<u>Dr. St. John</u>: Enrollment today is 4288 students. He will conduct secretarial interviews this week. District construction manager Bill Woodward is unavailable this week, so he will be attending the weekly construction meetings.

The Town of Sahuarita is conducting two public meeting, March 29 on construction on Sahuarita Road from I-19 to La Villita Rd, and April 12 on the I-19 and Sahuarita Road Interchange. He and Mrs. Gates will be taking a food service field trip to several locations in Phoenix next week. He is scheduled to attend a construction seminar all day next Wednesday. Since our construction manager Bill Woodward is resigning effective June 30, Dr. St. John will be more than normally

involved in the construction process. The SFB will address the issue of land for the new high school next Thursday, and he will be attending that meeting.

The White Elephant Scholarship Committee will be reviewing applications next week. He attended an ASA legislative action committee meeting this past week and met with John Arnold of the SFB afterwards. He also attended a meeting this morning with the Town on safety on Sahuarita Road.

A meeting with the some members of the Continental School District Governing Board was held and another meeting will be scheduled to discuss high school curriculum. He also met with the core members of the arts committee from Green Valley. Mrs. Gates and Dr. St. John met with representatives of Pima County Parks and Recreation regarding summer schedules for the Sopori pool.

The following students were winners in the State Masonic Essay Contest: Jasmine Harris, SPS; Swapna Vettiyil, SIS, Bethany Nay, SHS, Emily VanWagenen, SHS. All the students received monetary awards. Teachers Mike Lewis and Mary Kraus received grants of \$300 each for use in their classrooms. Eight students from SMS had projects in the Southern Arizona Regional Science and Engineering Fair.

High School athletic director Larry Cleveland is a finalist for the Arizona Interscholastic Association Administrator of the Year award. Dr. St. John received a letter from district patron Mark Dresang, thanking the Board for all the work it is doing on behalf of the children of our communities.

Dr. St. John reviewed a spreadsheet showing the other districts in Pima County that have overrides of one type or another in place. Compared to other school districts in Pima County and how they seem to have more money than we do. He thanked the voters of the district for approving our override. We are sometimes unfairly compared to Catalina Foothills district. They have an M&O override for \$2.2 Million, K-3 override for \$666,000, capital override for \$600,000 for an addition of \$3.5 million to their budget or \$726 per student. That is one of the reasons they appear to have some more "things" than we do. Flowing Wells gets another \$448 per student. What Sahuarita is doing is \$450 per student. We have an M&O override and that is it. Several districts transfer money from Capital funds to M&O funds to help support salaries and other M&O functions. Our district does not. Our capital funds are used for upkeep on our campuses.
