Overview

- ▶ The Saint Louis Public School District will provide extended summer learning opportunities to an estimated 5400 students in grades PreK-12. The model is project-based and provides cross-curricular connections with field experiences.
- ▶ Proposed number of sites: 21 (includes Griscom)
- ▶ Proposed dates: June 4 to June 28, 2012
 - Tier I from 7:30 AM-1:50 PM
 - Tier II from 9:00 AM-3:20 PM
- ▶ The proposed budget: \$3,000,000.00
- ▶ Staffing will be at 15:1 for elementary, 20:1 for middle and high schools, and appropriate staffing to support IEP's.



Background

- ▶ The results of the analysis of summer school 2011 were used to determine the instructional design for 2012.
 - Members of the Academic Team (30), Executive Leadership Team (20), and principals (75) vetted the data and made recommendations for the model.
- ▶ Specific emphasis was placed on addressing student attendance and academic growth.
- ▶ The evaluation instrument will be collaboratively developed between the Office of Assessment and Accountability and the Academic Office.



Summer School 2012 Population:

- ▶ Preschool Transition Program
 - First Time Kindergarten
 - Identified P3 and P4 Students
- ▶ Elementary
 - Grades 3 and 4 per Senate Bill 319
 - Grades K-5 includes English Speakers for Other Languages (ESOL)
- ▶ Middle School
 - Grades 6 and 7 Students
 - Grades 6-8 ESOL Students
- ▶ Extended School Year (ESY) Program
 - PreK-12 Students with ESY in the Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- ▶ High School Transition Program
 - Grades 8 to 9 served by the High School Initiative Grant (Check and Connect)
- ▶ High School
 - Grades 9-12 (Credit Recovery Students)
 - Grades 9-12 (End of Course Interventions)
- ▶ Alternative Programs



Instructional Program

- ▶ Preschool:
 - Social and emotional skills
 - Academic readiness with emphasis on language development
- ▶ Elementary:
 - Guided reading
 - Project-based integrated units
 - Field experiences aligned to units
- ▶ Middle:
 - Renaissance Math and Read 180
 - Project-based integrated units
 - Field experiences aligned to units
 - 8th to 9th grade transition program (High School Initiative Grant)
- ▶ High:
 - Credit Recovery and ACE
- ▶ Alternative
 - Credit Recovery and Missouri Option Program
