• Pick an important national issue that appears frequently in the news. Get approval from me if you go beyond ONE of the following suggestions:

LGBTQ Rights
The Special Counsel Investigation
Conflict with North Korea
Conflict in the Middle East
Abortion
Jobs in the United States
The Environment

Read stories addressing this issue <u>between June 15<sup>th</sup> and August 20th</u>. You can set up Google alerts or just follow the story from publication to publication. You must source stories from at least TWO different reputable publications over the course of the project. They may be opinion pieces or informative news articles. • Keep a journal in the form of a Google Doc entitled "Media Critique: (Insert the issue you picked)." Share it with me (asimmons@srcs.org). Between the end of this school year and the beginning of the next school year, evaluate at least SIX stories about your issue. Your evaluations (approximately 150-200 words apiece) should include: a) a brief

summary of the story; b) whether or not it altered your opinion on the issue or taught you something new; and c) a brief discussion of how the story/publication addressed the issue (Was there an opinion expressed? If it wasn't an opinion story, does it appear to have a bias anyway? How did it make you feel?). Format each entry like this:
