Stanford Medical Youth Science Program

- For low-income students, first generation
- Student will live at Stanford, attend lectures taught by professors, participate in labs, writing seminars, intern at a hospital.
- Get a mentor, experience being a college student
- Exposure to different careers in medicine and health
- Need to have a minimum GPA of 2.75

- 2 Letters of Recommendation (one from a math/science teacher)
- Applications due February 13
- Free tuition
- Have an interest in science/medicine
- Have B- average in some science classes



 - Shifts available Monday-Thursday from 3pm-5:30pm. Help with homework, free play and physical activities

Marinwood Camp Counselor

• Camp Counselor (Full-Time):

- Have previous child care or camp experience
