Study Week Reminders

Below are a few key points:

Study Week:

Study Week should be a true "Study Week" for our students. This means the following:

- 1) No tests or quizzes, unless part of a **review** for the final exam.
- 2) No new material should be introduced.
- 3) No field trips should be scheduled.
- 4) No homework should be provided that is not **related to final exams**.
- 5) No new projects due.
- 6) No non-essential call slips (students out of class).

Seniors At Risk of Not Graduating

Teachers of Seniors: We need to notify families of seniors as soon as possible if they will not pass a class that may be required for graduation. Of course, we like to provide as much advance notice as possible.

If you have a senior who is in danger of failing your class, please ensure that you do the following:

- Reach out to the student and create a plan for improvement
- Communicate your concern and recommendations for intervention to the student's parent
- Inform the counselor, and keep the counselor in the loop regarding developments as graduation approaches In addition, prioritize grading for seniors and consider administering exams early.

- one of your seniors is in danger of failing your class (please keep us in the loop as information is updated)
- one of your seniors WILL fail your class, in which case graduation eligibility may be compromised
