College Board Forum 2022



Last week Lauren Inman, Caitlin Righetti-Marweg and I attended the College Board Forum 2022. As shared previously, we planned to attend the conference primarily to learn about AP Pre-Calculus, and to revisit the AP Computer Science A course which was last offered at TL in 2017. At the conference we learned about new four new AP courses on the horizon, in addition to hearing a lot about the Pre-AP program and how we can continue to increase the numbers of students accessing AP at Terra Linda by offering heterogenous (non-tracked) pre-AP courses in grades 9 and 10. Below are a few topics covered with a brief explanation for each.

- <u>Pre-AP courses</u>: Pre-AP English 9, Pre-AP English 10, Pre-AP World, Pre-AP Biology (NGSS), Pre-AP Chemistry (NGSS)
- New AP Courses: 4 new courses aligned with student's interests (AP Pre-Calculus (2023-2024), AP African American Studies (2024-2025), AP Anatomy & Physiology, AP Business Principles)
- <u>AP Program Support</u>: AP Courses provide a pathway forward with a mentor. Mental Health focus shared across all programs.
- <u>AP Program Updates: Looking Ahead Presentation</u>
- <u>Using Pre-AP to Address Unfinished Learning Presentation</u>
- AP Computer Science Principles and Student Outcomes Presentation
- Supporting College Access and Success for Hispanic Students Presentation
- Increase AP Participation and Readiness with Pre-AP Presentation
- Introducing AP Precalculus Presentation

Marin Career Technical Education Center at TLHS (spring 2023)

Through a partnership between the Marin County high school districts and the Marin County Office of Education, the new Marin Career Technical Education (CTE) Center, located on the campus of Terra Linda High School, in San Rafael, will open to students countywide this spring. The Marin CTE Center will expand the variety of available CTE courses and increase student accessibility by offering classes in the afternoons, evenings, and weekends, and providing transportation options across the county. This project is being funded through the Marin County Office of Education in partnership with private donors.

Through the CTE Center we will be expanding courses at Terra Linda. This spring 2023, we will be adding a ROP Careers in Education course with a paid summer student internship. The course will be taught during 7th period on the TLHS campus by a TLHS CTE instructor. We will begin recruiting students in mid-November for the course. Similar to ROP Medical, the ROP Careers in Education course will provide students with a paid summer internship as a paraprofessional in Marin County earning \$24 per hour.
