- 2) Targeted interventions for students needing extra support, in particular, those who are in danger of failing a class.

Therefore, we do want to honor these needs. If you and your student have determined that a tutorial period is needed, we will continue to allow students to attend a tutorial period. Again, any movement (signing in/out) during the tutorial will only be for a very specific need, monitored by teachers. The library will be an option ONLY for those students with a prearranged tutoring session (through Steve Coleman). Term 4 Progress_Grades Due May 2nd

Term 4 Progress period grades are due to be posted in AERIES by 9:59 PM Tuesday, May 2nd. Please ensure that a letter grade is posted for students in danger of failing so that students (parents, counselors, etc.) are aware of their progress in your class as we head toward finals. Comment codes should also be used, when appropriate and helpful, to give feedback on the areas in which students can improve. Please consider using the TL Remediation Form with select students to outline the steps needed to receive a passing grade.

Teachers of Seniors - we need to notify families of seniors as soon as possible if they will not pass a class that may be required for graduation. Of course, we like to provide as much advance notice if a student won't graduate.

If you have a senior who is in danger of failing your class, please ensure that you do the following:

- Reach out to the student and create a plan for improvement
- Communicate your concern and recommendations for intervention to the student's parent
- Inform the counselor, and keep the counselor in the loop regarding developments as graduation approaches

In addition, prioritize grading for seniors and consider administering exams early. Let the appropriate counselor know if:

- one of your seniors is in danger of failing your class (please keep us in the loop as information is updated)
- one of your seniors WILL fail your class, in which case graduation eligibility may be compromised.

Master Schedule Build Mon. May 8th

This is a friendly reminder that our Master Build for the 2023-24 school year will take place this Monday, May 8th. <u>A calendar invite has been sent to Department Chairs</u>. Department Chairs will join the build during their prep periods and will spend time analyzing and troubleshooting potential conflicts.
