### 9. <u>Educational Services</u> – Mr. Bangs

a. Special Education – Mr. Nathan Moreno, Special Education Coordinator addressed the Board and reviewed what the Special Education Program will look like for 2018/2019 school year. The changes are based upon

the recommendations made on the implementation plan. (See attached presentation.)

There were some concerns from the audience and Board included: Board and audience:

- President Perez-Aguilera asked how teachers' evaluations conducted.
   Does Mr. Moreno complete them or does Principal. Mr. Moreno said it was a joint effort. The Principal is in charge but he gives them input.
- Ms. Woodrow asked how the co-teaching process going to work if special education students are going to be pushed in to regular education classes. Mr. Bangs responded that they will not do quick switches. They are front loading the information and will do planning and training.
- Board President Perez-Aguilera asked how involved were the parents in the planning and do they know this is happening. Mr. Moreno responded that he has met with parents and his team and they have shared the changed. Mr. Moreno's goal is to change the mentality that this is a service, not a place for students to remain in. He has worked with staff at the sites and they are aware why this is happening. It is a change for everyone.
- Mrs. Reeder, parent asked how many minutes of speech instruction does a student in a severe spectrum receive. Mr. Moreno answered that it's based on the student's individual need but it could be range 2-30 minute sessions a week or one hour a week. President Perez-Aguilera encouraged Mrs. Reeder to make an appointment to meet with Mr. Moreno to answer her questions.
- Ms. Aidee Aldaco, parent, asked what the plans for elementary inclusions were. Mr. Moreno said there were plans and there would also be the use of a Learning Centers. The Learning Centers will be based on the needs of the sites at the elementary schools and high school.
- Ms. Woodrow asked about the inclusion model and if there was going to be class where the students could go to. Mr. Moreno said yes, the Learning Centers. Ms. Woodrow asked if there was going to be a teacher there because if the student "freaks out" and the Learning Center could end up with as many students as in a classroom. Mr. Bangs responded that this was a framework of options for the I.E.P. teams to consider. It's a transition and they will honor the IEP needs and will work on a communication plan.
- President Perez-Aguilera agreed that there was a need to develop this
  communication plan and for staff to make sure all the
  changes/modifications are communicated to all stakeholders before
  changes take place.
