About the Community

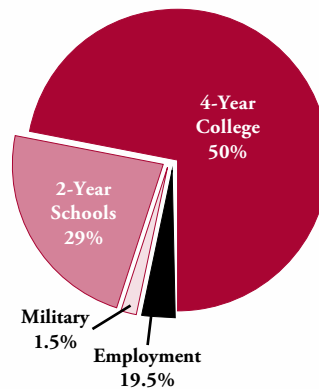
Southampton is a vibrant, culturally diverse community nestled between the Peconic Bay and the Atlantic Ocean on the East End of Long Island, 100 miles from New York City. An area rich in history, Southampton is a residential, beach and farming community served by several business districts, art and historical museums, a library and a hospital. Its workforce includes tradespeople, entrepreneurs, artists and working professionals. The year-round population of approximately 11,500, which encompasses the Village of Southampton, the Shinnecock Indian Nation and the neighboring hamlets of North Sea and Water Mill, triples during the summer season.

Southampton families, many of whom have been in the community for generations while others have only recently immigrated to the United States, bring an array of life experiences to our high school. The richness of Southampton High School's diversity is reflected by the 23 countries of origin, the many native languages spoken and the vast range of socioeconomic differences among its students.

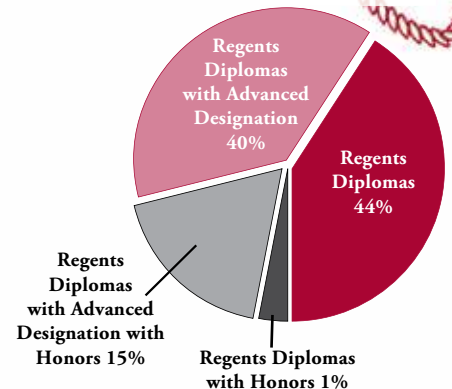
While a relatively small school of 594 students, Southampton High School offers a broad variety of educational opportunities to its students to meet their individual needs.

CLASS OF 2023 PLANS

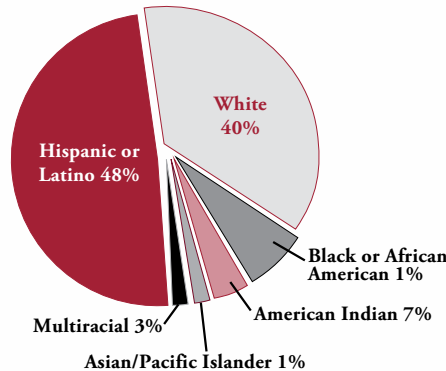


DIPLOMAS GRANTED 2023

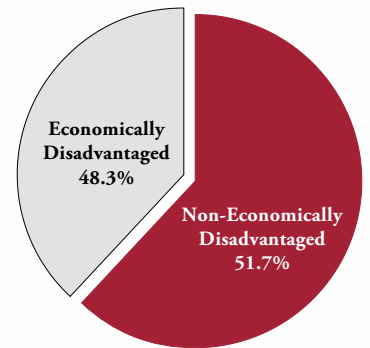

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UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES

EASTERN LONG ISLAND ACADEMY OF APPLIED TECHNOLOGY: Southampton High School offers 11th and 12th grade students the opportunity to take a wide range of career and trade education classes through Eastern LI Academy of Applied Technology. Southampton High School hosts the Carpentry/Residential Construction and Home Improvement program and the Clinical Medical Assisting Program in partnership with Stony Brook Southampton Hospital. Both programs expose students to unique skills, apprenticeship programs, industry certification and career opportunities.

LANGUAGE OFFERINGS: Southampton High School offers the opportunity to study American Sign Language, French, Italian, Latin and Spanish. Southampton High School is designated as an International Spanish Academy with a dual language program beginning in elementary school. Please see the next page for more information.

LEGACY DIPLOMA: Southampton High School values the contribution its students make to the local community and therefore offers a diploma endorsement called a Legacy Diploma. Students earn this distinction by contributing a minimum of 65 hours of community service to the Southampton community over their high school careers.

MUSIC AND ART OFFERINGS: Our students are regularly selected to participate in the New York State School Music Association's All-State and All-County festivals, as well as the Suffolk County Music Educators' Association Festival. Our art students have received recognition in juried exhibitions at the local, state and national levels.

PROJECT LEAD THE WAY: Project Lead the Way provides a comprehensive approach to STEM education. PLTW students engage in open-ended problem-solving, learn and apply the engineering design process, and use the same industry-leading technology and software as are used in the world's top companies. Students are immersed in design as they investigate topics such as sustainability, mechatronics, forces, structures, aerodynamics, digital electronics and circuit design, manufacturing and the environment, which gives them an opportunity to learn about different engineering disciplines before beginning postsecondary education or careers. Some PLTW courses offer dual enrollment through Rochester Institute of Technology.

SCIENCE OFFERINGS: Our students have the opportunity to utilize our unique science facilities and programs. **Astronomy** courses utilize our state-of-the-art planetarium to introduce and study the solar system and to carry out detailed research. **Oceanography/Marine Science, Aquaculture, Marine Research** and **Hatchery Management** courses utilize our 2,000-square-foot marine science lab. Students gain knowledge and awareness of the local and global marine environment through semester-long studies, learn the fundamentals of running an aquaculture operation and experience running a marine science lab. The Marine Research course allows students to gain valuable critical thinking skills to design unique research projects working with animals in the lab including octopuses, corals and various fishes.

HONORS/ AP COURSES

Southampton High School believes that the entire student body should have access to academically challenging, rigorous, multileveled classes.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES: There are a total of 12 AP classes offered at the high school. All students enrolled in an AP course are required to take the AP exam to earn an AP designation on their transcript.

COLLEGE CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES: Students have access to dual enrollment courses for potential college credit through four college institutions. Dual enrollment courses are noted in the course listing with asterisks.

HONORS COURSES: Several honors-level classes are offered to students in various grade levels. Honors courses are noted in the course listing with (H).

INDEPENDENT STUDY: Independent study is offered on an academic or advanced level to students with a teacher mentor and administrative approval.

ACCREDITATION: New York State Education Department and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

INTERNATIONAL SPANISH ACADEMY: Southampton High School was designated an International Spanish Academy by Spain's Ministry of Education in September 2015. This designation, also awarded to the district's intermediate and elementary schools (the only district in New York State to have all schools named as ISAs), is the culmination of the district's 12-year commitment to bilingual education. Its dual-language program is designed to develop literacy and competency in both the Spanish language and Spanish and Latin American cultures. Students in the program are assessed using the Diploma in Spanish as a Foreign Language, an assessment and official accreditation of fluency in the Spanish language created and recognized by Spain's Ministry of Education.

SOUTHAMPTON HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

Southampton High School is a four-year public high school with an enrollment of 594 students. The students from the district's elementary school (pre-K-4) and intermediate school (5-8) are joined by students from Our Lady of the Hamptons (pre-K-8) and the Tuckahoe School District (pre-K-8), neither of which has a high school program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a minimum of 22 credits to qualify for a New York State high school diploma. As noted in the Diplomas Granted pie chart on the first page, Southampton students typically earn well above the minimum credits, which include:

GRADING & RANKING

- A cumulative unweighted grade point average for each student is calculated using all graded, credit-bearing courses starting in grade 9 (we do not include any courses prior to ninth grade in the calculation of a student's grade point average).
- Students must sit for Regents Exams at the conclusion of the corresponding course. When Regents are retaken, the higher grade is reflected on the transcript. Regents exams are not included in the calculation of the GPA.
- The NYS Regents Examination taken to meet any diploma requirement, and the score[s] achieved, must be displayed on the student transcript. Requests must be made in writing to remove a Regents Examination score that is not required for a student's anticipated diploma type from the transcript. A request to remove a Regents exam score will not be permitted for a diploma type that has already been earned.
- Physical education is included in a student's GPA.
- Southampton High School does not rank students.

COVID-19 RESPONSE TO GRADING AND TRANSCRIPTS

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Southampton School District implemented the following:

- Final grades for the 2019-2020 school year are reflected as Pass/Fail.
- Due to the cancellation of the June 2020 Regents Exams and partial cancellation of the June 2021 Regents Exams, exam credit was awarded in a course of study culminating in a Regents to students who attained a course average that meets or exceeds the required passing grade by the school. This is denoted with an "E" in place of a Regents exam score.
- Students in Advanced Placement courses were given the choice to opt out of the corresponding AP exam for 2019-2020, 2020-2021, and 2021-2022 school years.
- Eligible students receive a "Special Appeal" to earn a diploma with a lower score on the Regents exam for the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years. Student eligibility/conditions for the special appeal include taking the Regents exam at least once during the June/August 2022, January/June/August 2023 test administration periods, receiving a score of 50-64 on the Regents exam during one of the above administrations, and attaining a course average that meets or exceeds the required passing grade by the school. This special appeal is denoted with an "SA" in place of a Regents exam score on the transcript.
