SENIOR CITIZEN COURTESY CARDS

As a cooperative effort between the schools located within the jurisdiction of the Town of Colonie, a common Senior Citizen Courtesy Card has been developed. The card bears the Town of Colonie logo and entitles senior citizens to attend school events in both North Colonie and South Colonie school districts.

- A. The Senior Citizen Courtesy Card will be issued to Town of Colonie residents who are at least 60 years of age or 55 years of age with a permanent disability. Proof of age must be shown in order to receive a card.
- B. For South Colonie residents, Senior Citizen Courtesy Cards will be issued at the South Colonie District Office. Cards may also be obtained at the Town of Colonie Senior Resources Department located in the Beltrone Living Center, 6 Winners Circle, Albany, New York 12205.
- C. The Senior Citizen Courtesy Card is not transferable and is to be used only by the person to whom issued.
- D. Holders of Senior Citizen Courtesy Cards shall be entitled to attend, at no cost, the various sports events, musical, theatrical, and other activities sponsored by the schools in the Town of Colonie. It should be noted that sectional athletic events or non-South Colonie events are not covered by the courtesy card.
- E. The cards will be numbered and a record of the name and address of each card holder shall be kept in the school district office.
- F. Building Principals shall be responsible for making necessary arrangements to assure that the Senior Citizen Courtesy Card will be properly honored by those in charge of the events to which they provide free admission.
- G. Holders of Senior Citizen Courtesy Cards who wish to attend an event where seats are reserved must call the school at least seven (7) calendar days prior to the event in order to reserve the requested seats.
- H. If the number of people seeking admission to an event exceeds the audience capacity of the facility, admission will be on a "first come, first served" basis for both Senior Citizen Courtesy Card holders and those paying the regular admission charge.
- I. When cards are issued, all Senior Citizen Courtesy Card holders will be given a copy of this Regulation for their information.
- J. Any questions regarding the Senior Citizen Courtesy Card or problems related to its use are to be referred to the Superintendent's office.
