C. Interfund Transfers

South Colonie Central Schools has received approval to receive a NYSERDA Energy Grant for the period of 2/1/2022 through 1/31/2027. The total grant is \$257,500. The District must contribute a total of \$54,500 to receive the maximum of \$100,000 in reimbursement during the first 3 years of the grant. Years 4 and 5 would be fully funded by the District in the amount \$103,000 with a potential of \$10,000.00 in bonus revenue from NYSERDA. Years 4 and 5 are not guaranteed and would require approval.
