

Driving Training Education

The District may offer a Driver Training Education Program when staffing and funding are available. Any such program will be conducted in compliance with all requirements in the Idaho Standards for Public School Driver Education and Training as approved by the State Board of Education.

Anyone residing in the District between the ages of 14 1/2 through 21 years of age, irrespective of whether they are enrolled in the District, is eligible for to enroll in the District’s driver training program. Such program, in the discretion of the Board, may be conducted after school hours, on Saturdays, or during regular school vacation periods. The District may offer a joint training program with other districts.

No charge or enrollment fee shall be required of a student not enrolled in the District, unless public school students required to pay such enrollment fees or charges. A fee may be assessed to cover those costs which are not reimbursed by State funds.

The purpose of the program is to introduce students to a course of study that leads to the eventual development of skills appropriate for a licensed driver. The traffic education program is designed to meet the criteria established by the State Department of Education.
