A Message From Your Board President

Dear Residents,

This year's budget process has certainly presented many challenges. The two main sources of revenue to fund school districts are taxes and State Aid. Sachem will be receiving the same level of State Aid we received approximately eight years ago. Despite this disappointing news, the Board of Education and administration have worked cooperatively and tirelessly to create a budget that continues to maintain that delicate balance of providing excellent opportunities for our students while remaining sensitive to the needs of our taxpayers. We have encouraged and demonstrated participation, transparency and interdependence as we have been traveling to all parts of our district and meeting with members of our community since January.

I sincerely believe that we have listened carefully and developed a budget that holds our children as our highest priority. Last year's budget went up 1% on the expenditure side and this year we have developed a budget that has only increased .58% on the expenditure side. If the community supports and passes this budget, there will be no change in the elementary class sizes, full day kindergarten, the GATE program, Science Research, all of our current Music and Athletic groups/teams, Cheerleading, Arrowettes, Marching Band, Robotics and all of our current clubs and activities that our students enjoy each and every day. A passed budget would also mean that we would not have to close schools or sell the Waverly soccer fields.

The Sachem Central School District is proud of our outstanding reputation. We are recognized near and far for our academic excellence and for our
