

The Chemist's Resume

A resume is written by a person to obtain a job or position of importance. It usually contains a person's formal education, history, experience and accomplishments.

The length of a resume should be confined to a single sheet of paper, preferably only the front side. Sometime in the near future, you will have to write your own resume containing these features.

This project will familiarize you with the process of writing a resume as well as learn about some historical events in chemistry through the accomplishments of the chemist.

You will write a resume for the chosen chemist, including:

History: birth date, country, and city

Educational History: Where they went to school, including their place of research

Experience: Those activities that are special to the individual that occurred to them.

Accomplishments: The important findings or work the person did and when they did it, as well as a brief synopsis of what it involved.

There are **Internet** sites that provide templates for writing resumes as well as instructions.

Microsoft Word has resume templates in the new files. Get there from the **start** bar and choose **New Document**, then **Microsoft Word**. You will get a group of tabs, one of which is **Resumes**. You can go through them and choose a style you like
