


What Students Should Be Doing...

- List of Colleges (Reach/Target/Safety)
- Submit Recommendation Questionnaires to Counselor/Teachers
- Visit Colleges/Interviews
- Completing Applications
- Completing Testing Requirements
- NCAA Eligibility (if an athlete)
- Making Decisions




Components of the Application

- Main Application
 - Common Application (www.commonapp.org)
 - SUNY Application (www.suny.edu/student)
- Transcript
- Testing (Test Optional vs. SAT / ACT)
- Essay/Personal Statement
- Activities/Resume
- Counselor Letter of Recommendation
- Teacher Letters of Recommendation

Completing Testing Requirements

- Many of colleges are continuing Test Optional for 2025 applications
- SAT Reasoning Test
 - November, December
 - www.collegeboard.org
- ACT
 - October (currently late registration) and December
 - www.actstudent.org
- SAT Subject Tests
 - College Board is no longer offering



Types of Admission

- Early Decision (Binding)
 - May only apply ED to one school
 - If accepted, commitment to attend
- Early Action (Non-Binding)
 - Apply by early deadline, notified earlier
- Regular Decision
 - Deadline Admission – Formal deadline after which applications are no longer accepted.
 - Rolling Admission – Applications accepted on ongoing basis until class has been filled.

By April 1st – Colleges notify student of admission decision

By May 1st – Student notifies college of intention to attend/places deposit

Naviance: Family Connection

- Sachem High School submits transcripts and letters of recommendation electronically through Naviance.
- How will this affect students:
 - Students using the Common Application must:
 1. Create their account at www.commonapp.org
 2. Complete the "Education" section of the Common Application
 3. Complete the FERPA waiver (under "My Colleges" tab)
 4. Log into their Naviance account and enter their email address to link their Common Application to their Naviance account
 - Students can add requests for teacher letters of recommendation.
 - Students can check the status of their document submission via their Naviance account.

Naviance: Additional Features

- Through Naviance students can also:
 - Search for colleges using a variety of criteria eg: distance from home, majors, cost, public/private etc.
 - Take a “career interest inventory” to learn more about a career that might fit their likes, interests, and strengths
 - Explore careers, tasks of various careers, projected salary, education needed
 - Take a “learning styles” questionnaire to learn more about how they learn best-eg: auditory, visual spatial, kinetic, etc.
 - Take a Myers-Briggs type personality questionnaire.

Sachem High School Procedures

Student Submits Directly to College:

- Completed application
- Application fee
- Essay
- Activities/Resume (included on application)

Student Requests:

From High School:

- Transcript
- Letters of Recommendation

From Testing Agency:

(only if student is choosing to report test scores to the college)

- SAT (www.collegeboard.org)
- ACT (www.actstudent.org)

For students applying to Suffolk County Community College

- Applications are processed on a first-come/first-served basis. The sooner the application is completed, the sooner the student will be scheduled for placement testing/register for classes.

Application Requirements:

- Application & fee
- Transcript
- Immunizations
- No essay!
- No letters of recommendation*

* A handful of programs at Suffolk CCC may require letters of recommendation. Please check specific program requirements (ie., Honors Program).

- Majority of programs – Rolling Admission
- More competitive programs – May have a deadline to apply (ie., Nursing, Veterinary Science Technology, etc.)

Placement:

- *Academic Advising Appointments* to review placement / make determination if remedial math/reading is required.
- *SAT/ACT* not required / only used to determine placement
- *Accuplacer* – Student will be notified if required

Financial Aid Forms

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

- Required by all institutions for financial aid
- Available sometime between October 1- December 1, 2024. More information: <https://studentaid.gov/announcements-events/fafsa-support>
- References tax info from prior tax year (2023)

CSS Profile

- Required by some institutions
- Requests additional information to determine need.
- Submit Fall 2024
- \$25 for initial registration and submission to one college.
\$16 per additional college or university

Types of Financial Aid

- Scholarships (Gifts)
 - Academic
 - Athletic
 - Talent
 - Merit-based
 - Private, College, etc.
- Grants (Gifts)
 - Federal (PELL)
 - State (TAP, Excelsior, STEM)
 - College
- Loans (Borrow)
 - Student
 - Parent
- Work Study
 - On-campus job
