Building Trades Construction Project: 2022-23

Vermillion High School's Building Trades class has, in recent years, tackled projects from a car port for district vehicles, a storage building for equipment and even partnered with local home builders to build residential homes for Vermillion families. These students spend a double class period learning the valuable skills of basic construction as well as observing subcontractors such as plumbers and electricians.



Building Trades class helps students gain an understanding and appreciation of the skills necessary

in the various building trades. It is a hands-on experience that many students will point to as the class that helped them make a decision to enter a



related career field.

This year, the Building Trades students are not building a residential home, but rather scaling back

their projects to garden/yard storage buildings. The class is set up so that several buildings are built at once and then sold to community members, once complete.

Need a Tutor? How about a FREE Tutor?

The <u>Dakota Dreams Online Tutoring Program</u> provides free online tutoring to K–12 students in South Dakota in the subjects of English/Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Parents can register students for virtual one-on-one tutoring sessions using a simple and secure online platform.



Once registered, sessions can either be pre-scheduled or accessed on-demand. All sessions are taught by university students already accepted into the School of Education at Northern State University or Black Hills State University.

Dual Credit Courses

Spring Dual Credit registration opens November 1st-December 20th (see Mr. Hayes).

FAFSA

The 2023-2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will be available October 1, 2022. FAFSA can provide your student with grants, loans, and work study funds from the Federal Government. It is best to get it done early since some of the funds are available on a



first come first served basis. For a short video on how to fill out the FAFSA form, please click <u>here</u>. To fill out your FAFSA form, please visit <u>the FAFSA website</u>.

What are the deadlines for filling out the FAFSA form?

To be considered for federal student aid for the 2023-24 award year, you can complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form between Oct. 1, 2022, and 11:59 p.m. Central time (CT) on June 30, 2023.

Any FAFSA form corrections or updates must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CT on Sept. 10, 2023. However, many states and colleges have earlier deadlines for applying for state and institutional financial aid, use Find your state's deadline. Check with your college or career school about its deadlines. Because of the variation in state and college deadlines, it's highly recommended that you fill out the FAFSA form as soon as you can after Oct. 1 to ensure that you don't miss out on available aid.¹
