

# **April = Spring Assessments**

The transition into spring at VHS brings with it a focus on preparing to test our junior class while also gearing up for the final run toward the end of the year and graduation. While students are tested every year in middle school, the state assessments (Smarter Balanced Tests) are only administered once in high school - during the spring of the junior year. These assessments will be in the areas of English/Language Arts, Math and Science.



Our juniors will test on Tuesday and Wednesday, April 9th and 10th over math and science, in a large group setting and will test Monday and Tuesday, April 15th through the 17th over English/Language Arts content, in their junior English classes. In all, the entirety of the junior class is required by the state to be tested. The performance of the junior class on the state assessments each spring is a contributing factor into the overall score the South Dakota Department of Education assigns to Vermillion High School on our annual state report card.

Often, it is hard to get the students to "buy in" to the importance of the tests because they do not see the tests as having a direct bearing on them or their educational futures. Though numerous South Dakota schools will take scores on these assessments as part of the college entrance process. Nevertheless, the tests reflect directly upon the academic capacity of Vermillion High School students and are utilized to form the school and district's overall grade as an educational institution. To this end, we want to encourage you to help us motivate the juniors to do their best on these assessments. We want to encourage them to get a good night's sleep the night before, eat well and do not forget to charge their computers! If our juniors do these little things, it will help tremendously and may positively impact our scores, as well!

# VHS Co-Hosts Chef Anthony Warrior

On Wednesday, March 20th, the parents/caregivers/guardians, and friends of the Native student group of the Vermillion School District and students who are a part of the Living Learning Community from the Native American Cultural Center class at USD, convened for a delicious dinner and presentation. The food was prepared and served by Anthony Warrior, a Santee Chef who embraces traditional Native American Foods. Anthony's presentation was about Food Pathways.

Mr. Warrior is the Human Relations manager at the Nebraska Indian Community College based in Santee, NE. Warrior travels around Nebraska and other Midwestern states sharing his story and encouraging a return to traditional food pathways.





Dressed in Muscogee regalia, Anthony entertained people attending the dinner while also showing the benefits of a traditional Native American diet. Guests dined on bison meatloaf, three sisters' salad (hominy, beans, and squash with a maple vinaigrette), wild rice, and wild berry wojipe (pudding). The tea provided was one made of hibiscus, cinnamon, and honey. In addition, there were pecans covered with maple syrup and then roasted.

In his presentation, Mr. Warrior pointed out that "not only are we reestablishing a particular relationship with food, but also reinvigorating those relationships with plant and animal relatives, and the land itself. It is



not just about food, but a cultural renaissance."

Anthony went on to say that "we are tied to this earth with food offerings. Our bodies recognize that by altering the food, we are inviting in all the different problems, health issues, and difficulties with genetics. If we can break these behaviors, we could also explore what our bodies need, and break the addictions to sugar, fat and salts. We can start healing ourselves, our generations, and the world around us."





# Registration for 2024-25

Last week, registration forms were collected from current freshmen, sophomores and juniors. If you did not get the opportunity to discuss the class registration options with your student, it is possible that they turned in their form without your signature on it. We would encourage you to contact the Student Services office if you have any questions regarding your student's registration for next year's classes. Nothing is finalized at this time and anything can be changed or updated, if need be.

In the meantime, current eighth graders will have the opportunity to meet with Ms. Suing and Mr. Hayes on Thursday, April 11th in the morning. They will come home from school with registration forms on Thursday and those will be due back to Ms. Sayavong at the Middle School on Monday or Tuesday. Please contact the high school Student Services office with any questions you may have.

# SD Opportunity Scholarship

Starting in Fall 2023, the SD Opportunity Scholarship provides up to \$7,500 over four years to a qualifying student who attends an eligible higher education institution in South Dakota. The scholarship is distributed at the beginning of fall semester and the other half is distributed at the beginning of the spring semester:



- \$1,500 1st year of attendance
- \$1,500 2nd year of attendance
- \$1,500 3rd year of attendance
- \$3,000 4th year of attendance

There are two ways a student can become eligible for the Opportunity Scholarship:

### Option 1:

- Be a resident of South Dakota.
- Have an ACT Composite or Super Score of 24 or higher. · Complete the high school course requirements with no final grade below a "C" and a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 prior to graduation.
- Attend an accredited university, college, or tech school in South Dakota.
- Enter the program within 5 years of high school graduation.

Option 2: (has a higher ACT requirement, but no curriculum or GPA requirement)

- Be a resident of South Dakota.
- Have an ACT Composite or Super Score of 28 or higher and meet the ACT college readiness benchmarks scores equaling or exceeding 18 for English, 22 for Reading, 22 for Math, and 23 for Science.
- Attend an accredited university, college or tech school in South Dakota.
- Enter the program within 5 years of high school graduation.

### Summer and Fall Dual Credit

The application for summer registration will open March 1st and registration for fall courses will open April 1st. We would like to have all applications in by **May 15th** as this helps lower the stress of trying to apply just before classes start after we return from summer break.

Dual credit gives eligible students the chance to accelerate their education by enrolling in classes to receive both high school and college credit. You can find our dual credit basics document, along with other important information, on the dual credit webpage at https://ourdakotadreams.com/high-school/dual-credit/.

There is a wide variety of courses for students to choose from, including courses offered online, on campus. See Mr. Hayes if you have questions.

As a clarification of the difference between dual credit and advanced placement or AP: dual credit are courses students take at or sponsored by a college or university to obtain general education credit. There are currently two AP courses offered at VHS - Advanced Chemistry and AP Biology. Students elect or choose to take an exam towards the end of the second semester and then depending on their score, they could potentially earn college or university credits.

### **FAFSA Update**

Hopefully, if you are a parent of a senior, you and your student have had the chance to review the <u>2024-25 FAFSA form</u>. If you haven't, it is available for completion and has been working consistently for most students. Currently, the Federal Student Aid website reports that they have processed 6.6 million of 6.7 million FAFSA applications submitted.

The FSA site further indicates the information below for students once their application is processed.

### **Post-Processing Experience for Students**

Students will receive an email informing them that their FAFSA form has been fully processed and their FAFSA information has been sent to the schools they listed on their form.

Students who applied using the online FAFSA form will receive an email that they can access their FAFSA Submission Summary by logging in to StudentAid.gov using their account username and password.

The Department will send an email reminder to previous FAFSA applicants who have not yet submitted a 2024-25 FAFSA form.

Students will be able to make corrections to their FAFSA once their eligibility has been calculated and ISIR generated. Students may view their eligibility calculation by logging back into their Studentaid.gov account.

The Department will fully process paper applications in the weeks following.<sup>1</sup>
