Thank you...and why are you making this so hard for me?:) Seriously, this sort of support is why I've been here so long, and I will always, from the bottom of my heart, love the people of East Elementary and Vestavia Hills because of the caring heart of all of our community.

I'm far from the only person departing East this year, and I'd like to acknowledge a whole bunch of incredible faculty members who are also moving on. All of these great folks are leaving us to retire, or pursue an opportunity that is best for their family:

Carol Johnston has been at East longer than I have (not many can say that), having taught 1st grade for close to 30 years. After watching Carol teach her kiddos 25 years ago, I told her that I have not seen a more engaging, challenging teacher. After watching Carol teach last month, I can say the same thing. Carol loves her students and still has such enthusiasm for the craft of teaching.

Dedra Wade was one of my earliest recommendations to come on board as a teacher at East.
