Student Dashboard

This reference sheet is designed to help you navigate and understand how to use the student dashboard.

Navigation:

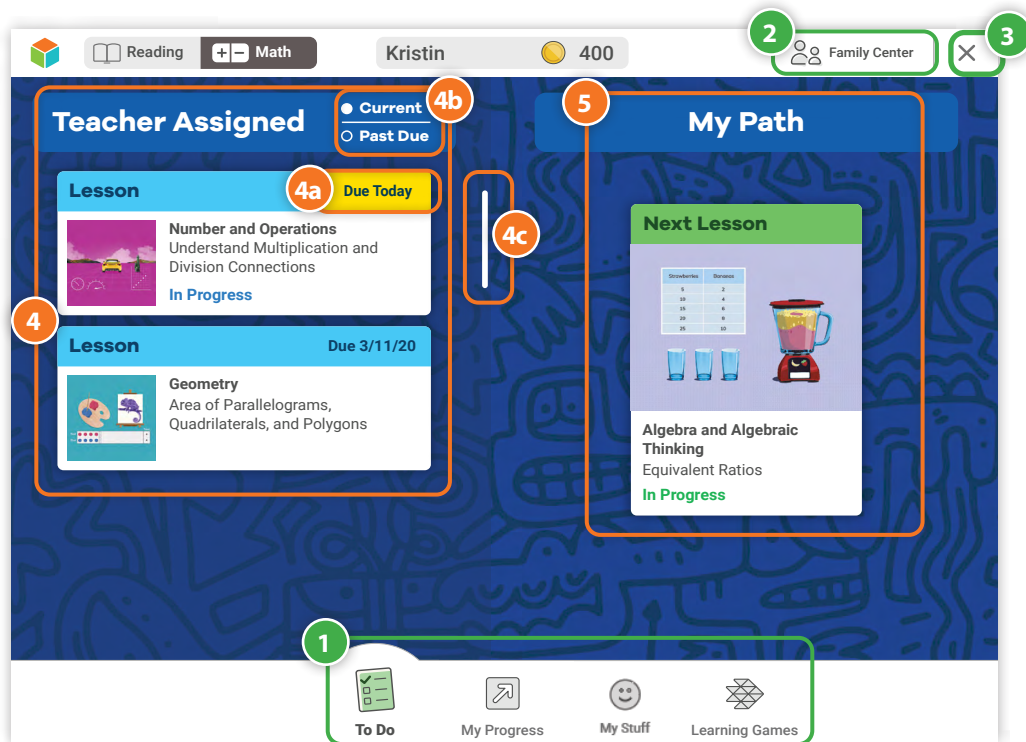
- 1 Students can use the bottom navigation to access **To Do**, **My Progress**, **My Stuff**, and **Learning Games** screens.
- 2 Family members can click the **Family Center** icon to learn more about how to support and encourage their child's success with *i-Ready*.
- 3 Students can click the **X** to log out.

To Do screen:

- 4 **Teacher Assigned:** Students can access assignments by clicking on them in their To Do screen.
 - 4a Assignments are **prioritized by due date** if set by the teacher.
 - 4b Students in Grades 3+ can use this toggle to see **Current** or **Past Due** assignments.
 - 4c Using the scroll bar, students will see up to five **Current** assignments and five **Past Due** assignments at a time.

Note: Students in Grades K–2 will see up to two Current assignments and two Past Due assignments at a time. Use the down arrow to view Past Due assignments (not pictured).

- 5 **My Path:** The Diagnostic will appear here when the teacher assigns it. When the student completes the Diagnostic, *i-Ready*-Assigned Lessons will appear here.



Note: Students in Grades K–2 have a developmentally appropriate interface. Certain features may vary in their presentation from the above image. The assignments and assessments a student sees on their dashboard are dependent on what has been assigned to the student by the educator as well as the student's personal learning path.



My Progress screen:

- 6 Students can use this **dropdown** to view their completed assignments. If filtering by completed lessons, students can further filter completed lessons by domain.
- 6a Students see the **date of completion** for completed work.
- 6b Students see their **scores** from the Diagnostic.



My Stuff screen: Students click this icon to select background themes and Study Buddy characters for Grades K–2.



Learning Games screen: Students click this icon to access playful fluency practice, allowing students to explore essential skills in a low-stakes setting.
