MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

The 2017-18 school year will be defined as one of the most significant in the history of Vestavia Hills City Schools. The mission of providing opportunities for students to learn without limits has been at the core of the work in our school system. Whether we see the changing face of school facilities or visit a classroom, it is evident that we continue to "grow" in our march toward excellence.

As our student body has grown significantly over the past few years, a capital plan has been in place to provide excellent facilities. Our Board of Education purchased Gresham Elementary School as part of its plan to implement K-5 elementary schools throughout the system beginning with the 2019-20 school year. Construction has dominated the landscape on several campuses this year. Projects were completed at Vestavia Hills Elementary East and Vestavia Hills Elementary Liberty Park. Other projects continue at Vestavia Hills Elementary West and Vestavia Hills Elementary Cahaba Heights.



Our students have continued to grow in their commitment to excellence in service learning, academics, and extracurricular events. Philanthropy was commonplace in our schools including projects to support needs of local, state, national, and international organizations. This year was a record year for scholarships offered to seniors at Vestavia Hills High School. Our academic, arts, and athletic teams competed successfully in state, national, and international competitions.

Teachers in Vestavia Hills have grown as professionals and leaders in the system. Many teachers have led professional development sessions, participated in a Teacher Leaders cohort, or completed advanced degrees and National Board Certifications. A number of teachers earned state and national recognition for their commitment to excellence.

Our system has continued to grow its reputation as one where every school provides exceptional opportunities for students. We welcomed another National Blue Ribbon School to the impressive list of those that have received it in the past.

The coming school year will build on a theme of growth. Construction will include preparing new middle school and elementary school facilities. Our system will complete its five-year accreditation process and gear up for a new strategic plan, both of which will serve to grow our capacity to reach our mission.

Vestavia Hills City Schools is a wonderful place to prepare our children for a future without limits. I look forward with much anticipation to seeing continued growth toward excellence!








VHCS BY THE NUMBERS






