Dear Families:

As a district, we are committed to the safety and education of all our students and we also want to clearly communicate with families about our learning environment.

The Wellsville Central School District is in compliance with regulations issued this summer by the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) requiring all school districts and Boards of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES) to test potable water fixtures used for drinking or cooking purposes for lead contamination, to remediate contamination where found, and to notify families of children and the public of test results. Levels of lead at any water outlet above 15 parts per billion (ppb) require action to remediate this issue and trigger notification requirements.

As required, the Wellsville Central School District tested all water sources in each school building for lead. We have received these results. Consistent with regulatory requirements, first draw water samples were taken after letting the water remain unmoving in the pipes over a period of 8 to 18 hours. I am writing to share the initial results we received from the testing.

In total, 344 drinking water samples were collected from the Elementary and Secondary School.

187 samples were taken from the Elementary School and 4 samples exceeded the threshold of 15 ppb as follows:

- 1 kitchen sink
- 2 locker room sinks
- 1 storeroom

157 samples were taken from the Secondary School and 26 samples the exceeded the threshold of 15 ppb as follows:

- 25 Science Laboratory sinks
- 1 Coaches Office sink

In response to the receipt of these test results, the water outlets that exceeded the testing level have immediately been taken out of service. The next step is to develop a remediation plan that will be approved and guided by the experts in the field of water remediation.

The timetable for remediation of each of the identified sources will depend on the availability of parts, installation, and the process for retesting. A copy of our water testing results will be available at the District Office, which is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 3:30 pm and results will also be posted on the District website at [www.Wellsvilleschools.org](http://www.Wellsvilleschools.org) under the District tab.

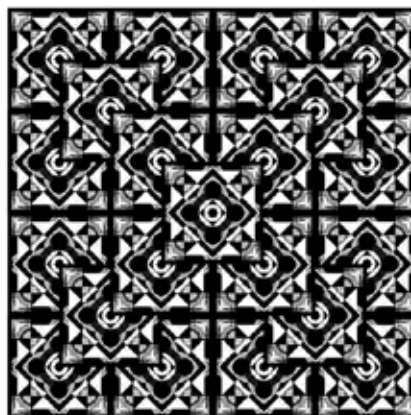
