WCS Odyssey of the Mind Teams Perform Well at Home Regionals

The Odyssey of the Mind regional competition was held at Wellsville Secondary School on Saturday, March 2. A total of 31 teams from area schools demonstrated their problem-solving skills and creativity. Wellsville's six teams all placed in the competition, and all but one will now advance to the state competition at Binghamton University on Saturday, March 23. State winners will then advance to the 2019 world competition at Michigan State University on May 22-25.

The competition requires teamwork and many hours of dedicated practice.

Special creativity and teamwork awards were given out before announcing problem and division winners.

An OMER award was also given out to Wellsville sixth grader Mackenzie Weinbauer, who was nominated for her outstanding dedication to her team while also being sick.

OM Region 19 director Jean Oliverio hosted the awards ceremony and said, "This OMER exemplifies the spirit and philosophy of Odyssey of the Mind.

She (Mackenzie) came to practice and jumped right in to help fix the props that fell apart two days before competition. When most students would have given up (due) to being sick, (but) she persevered and refused to let her team down."

Two Vacancies on the Board of Education

The Wellsville Central School Board of Education announces two school board vacancies expiring on June 30, 2019. These vacancies are for three-year terms and will expire June 30, 2022.

Anyone interested in running for the school board can pick up a petition at the District Office located in the Secondary School Complex at 126 West State Street in Wellsville.

The petition requires signatures of twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the district, and must be filed with the District Clerk at least thirty (30) days prior to the budget vote on May 21, 2019. The last day petitions can be accepted is April 22, 2019. Please direct any questions you may have to Dawn Youmans, District Clerk at 596-2170.



To qualify for membership on the school board, the following conditions must be met:

- Must be able to read and write.
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent.
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the dis-



trict for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before election.

- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year.
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family.
- May not be a current employee of the school board.
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office.



Absentee Ballots

Absentee ballots may be applied for at the office of the School District Clerk, Dawn Youmans, at 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY at least seven days before the date of the budget vote (May 21, 2019) if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the budget vote if the ballot is to be issued to the voter in person. Absentee ballots may not be mailed by the District Clerk earlier than 30 days before the vote. An absentee ballot must reach the office of the District Clerk, 126 West State St., Wellsville, NY not later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the budget vote (May 21, 2019).

■ **Neatness Counts!** We cannot overemphasize this point. Write down all of your activities (but be scrupulously honest), and write legibly and neatly in **black** ink. The Senior Data Information Sheet is how our community's scholarship donors will perceive you. Do not attach pages.

■ **Boys:** When you turn 18, you must register for Selective Service online at www.sss.gov.

■ **Scholarship Night is set for Tuesday, June 4.** If you are going to receive an award, your parents or guardians will receive a letter. However, all seniors are encouraged to attend.

■ Please inform the Guidance Office of your post high school graduation plans, college acceptances, scholarship opportunities, job offers, etc.

■ Check with your chosen college now if you need tuition assistance.

■ Please do not count on local scholarships to underwrite a majority of your college costs. These one-time awards may help pay for some books and perhaps a small portion of tuition. You should already have a financial plan in place.

■ **Do your very best these last few months!** Your senior year grades are very important. A final transcript will be mailed to your college in early July.

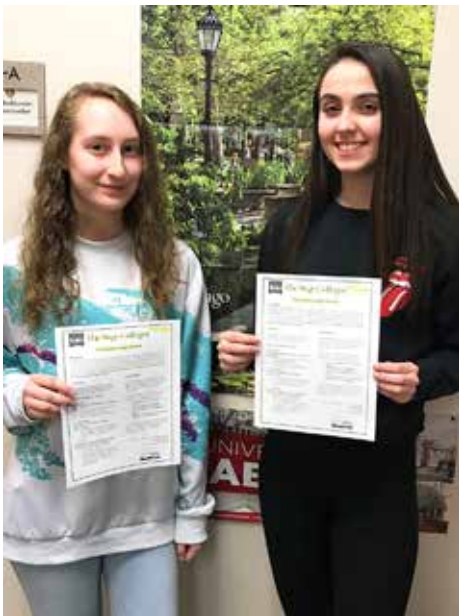


Elmira College Key Award

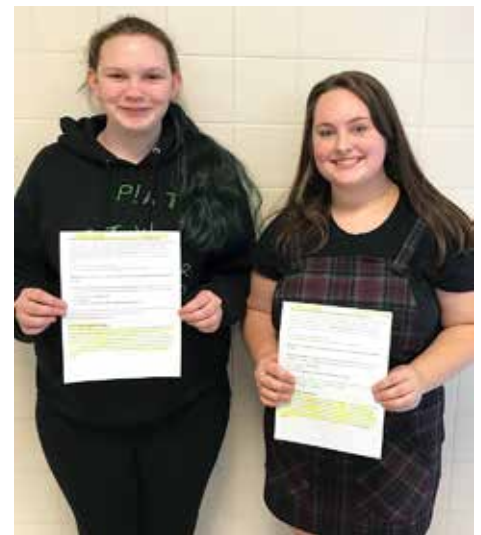
Wells College 21st Century Leadership Award Announced

Recognizing the need for ethical leadership, Wells College presents the 21st Century Leadership Award to high school juniors who demonstrate leadership ability in high school and community activities and exhibit academic excellence. Recipients are nominated by their school counselor and the administration in the spring of their junior year and are then recognized by the Admissions Committee. The 21st Century Leadership Award program is designed to honor these students and grant them a \$40,000 Scholarship for Leaders (\$10,000 per year) for four years of study at Wells College.

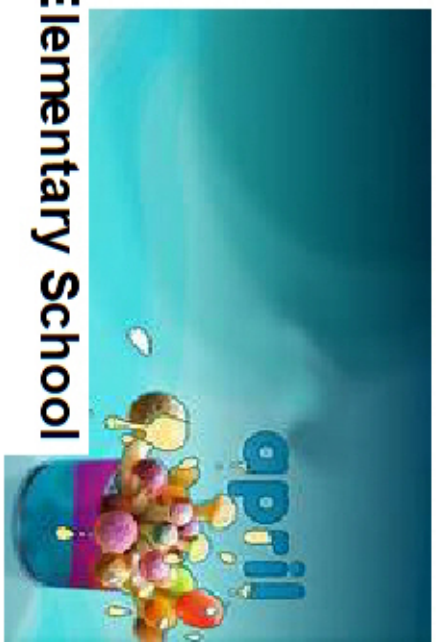

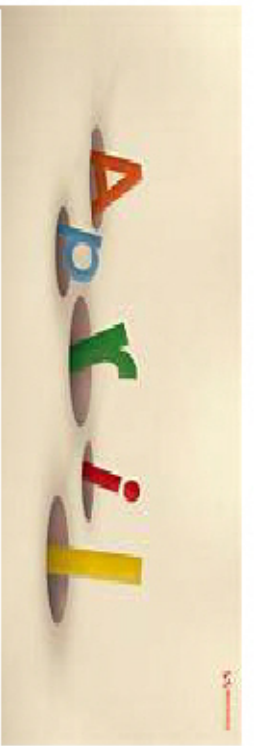

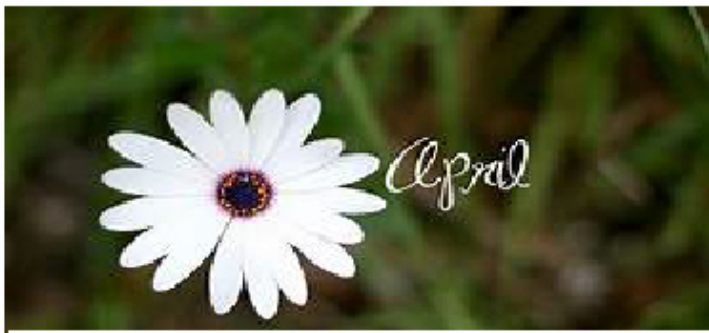
